

WATER MAIN EXTENDED.
 Extension of their water service into the districts on the west side of the river by a new main crossing on the foot bridge has been begun by the Bend Water Light & Power Co. The main, which is eight inches in size, will run from the corner of California and Congress streets, across Park addition, over the river and up to a connection with the main in Boulevard drive, a distance of 1743 feet. With this in use it is expected that a shortage in water, caused by the rapid construction on the west side and accompanying water use, will be relieved.

SHEVLIN OFFICIALS VISIT.
 Officials and heads of departments of The Shevlin-Hixon Company visited Bend last week spending several days here in an inspection of the plant and the lumbering operations. ROAD WORK PROCEEDS.
 Work on the west approach to the new county bridge is progressing. The top of the rock ledge at the head of the grade is being taken off and the material placed in the fill below with earth brought from other localities. When completed the road will run direct from the bridge to a junction with Kimbark avenue.
