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

KLAMATH FALLS, Sept. 8 .- The activity of Bonanza, 25 miles east of this city, in securing an extension of the proposed Strahorn railroad from Dairy, a distance fo seven miles, was evidenced at a recent meeting with 18.48 George E. Keeler, representing Keeler Brothers bonding house of Denver, at Klamath Falls. Bonanza proposes to bond for \$20,000, which is 20 per cent of its assessed valuation, and asks Keeler Brothers to handle the election. An offer was made its 17.50 committee to undertake this work with no charge for services if the election carries and Keeler Brothers are successful bidders or \$500 for legal services if the election fails. Several charter amendments will be necessary to make the bond issue

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
