

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

Be It Remembered, that a regular term of the County Court of the county of Crook and the State of Oregon was begun and held in the county court room in the county courthouse in Prineville, Oregon, on Wednesday, the sixth day of September, 1916, the same being the first Wednesday in said month and the time fixed by law for holding a regular term of said court, when were present at the hour of ten o'clock in the morning, the following officers: G. Springer, judge, presiding; J. F. Blanchard, Commissioner; H. J. Overturf, Commissioner; Warren Brown, Clerk; E. B. Knox, sheriff. Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Construction of bridge over the Deschutes river at Tumalo referred to Commissioner Overturf with instructions to build said bridge at once according to the plans and specifications furnished by the County Engineer.

In the matter of the formation of Deschutes county. On the presentation of petitions properly verified according to law, the court orders that the question of the formation of Deschutes county within the present territory of Crook county, be submitted to the vote of the electors of Crook county, at the next general election. (See order.)

Plat and dedication of the First Addition to Aubrey Heights presented, approved by court and ordered filed.

Whereas, upon inspection, this court has found the present county bridge over the Deschutes river on the Bend-Ladlaw road to be unsafe and dangerous for travel and in need of immediate repairs; and whereas, the Coast Bridge Company has a suitable bridge ready for immediate delivery; be it resolved that a contract be entered into with the said Coast Bridge Company for the purchase of said bridge on the following terms: For steel span (125 ft. by 18 ft.) \$3200; for steel foundation tubes 4 1/2 per pound, F. O. B. Portland; for erection of span, \$450; for setting and filling tubes with concrete, actual cost of labor and material; payment to be made for bridge May 1st, 1917, without interest from date.

County roads. Preliminary hearing on the Barnes Butte road, and the report on the survey on the Tumalo project No. 1 road and the H. W. Carlin road, continued until Monday, the 13th day of September, 1916.

Adjournment for day. Court convened this seventh day of September, 1916, at the hour of nine o'clock in the morning, when were present the following officers: J. F. Blanchard, commissioner, presiding; H. J. Overturf, Commissioner; Warren Brown, Clerk; E. B. Knox, Sheriff. Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Order made rescinding in part and modifying order of July 10th, 1916, in regard to Clerks and Judges of election as follows: Hereby ordered that clerks and judges of election in precincts where 100 or less votes were cast to be paid \$3 each for their services at each election held in the county; that where more than 100 votes were cast said Clerks and Judges be paid \$6 each for their services.

Further ordered that the clerk draw warrants in the sum of \$3 each to each clerk or judge of election in the last primary election in Crook county where more than 100 and less than 126 votes were cast in that precinct.

In as much as it is necessary that work on The Dalles-California Highway may be continued at this time; and as the balance allotted to Crook county (\$5000) by the State will not be available until December 31st 1916, it is hereby ordered that a loan be made by the county of Crook to the State Highway Commission in said sum of \$5,000 until said date, it is further ordered that the County Clerk draw five (5) warrants each in the sum of one thousand (\$1000) dollars in favor of the said State Highway Commission.

Whereas a petition has been presented to this court asking that the Terrebonne-O'Neil road be changed from a sixty to a forty foot road; and whereas a remonstrance has been presented to this change, signed by a much larger number of persons in said road district; said petition is hereby denied.

Petition presented for legalization of the South La Pine-Fish trap road. Continued for investigation of description therein.

Report of County Clerk on bounties paid by Crook county during months of July and August, 1916, received, approved and ordered filed. Petition and bond presented for establishment of Guy E. Dohson road; continued until Monday, the 13th day of September, 1916, and referred to District Attorney for opinion.

Whereas the old, main traveled roads in the vicinity of Dry Lake and Pringle Falls have been rendered impassable by the placing therein of fences, gates, wires and other obstructions; the county surveyor is hereby ordered to survey and relocate said main county roads from Fife to the Bend-Burns road and from Field to Pringle Falls.

It is further ordered that as soon as the county surveyor shall have surveyed and relocated said main county roads as above described, all owners, lessees and incumbrances of land adjacent to or crossed by said road, shall immediately remove from said roads all fences, gates, wires and other obstructions to travel which may be in said roads.

Order warrants drawn on General Fund in favor of J. F. Blanchard in sum of \$1000 and to H. J. Overturf in sum of \$1000 for use on county roads.

Court adjourned this seventh day of September, 1916, to meet in reg-

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BONANZA WOULD BOND.

KLAMATH FALLS, Sept. 8.—The activity of Bonanza, 25 miles east of this city, in securing an extension of the proposed Strahora railroad from Dairy, a distance to seven miles, was evidenced at a recent meeting with George E. Keeler, representing Keeler Brothers bonding house of Denver, at Klamath Falls. Bonanza proposes to bond for \$20,000, which is 20 per cent of its assessed valuation, and asks Keeler Brothers to handle the election. An offer was made its committee to undertake this work with no charge for services if the election carries and Keeler Brothers are successful bidders or \$500 for legal services if the election fails. Several charter amendments will be necessary to make the bond issue legal.

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
