

FOOTBALL LOOMS UP ON HORIZON

BEND TO HAVE FAST ELEVEN

Turnout Sunday Lures 20 Candidates
Ketchum Elected Coach-Captain.
Will Work by Lamp Light—
Games Are Scheduled.

Moleskins and pigskins are beginning to loom on the local horizon, with the close of the baseball season. Warriors of days past hear the call to the gridiron. The first regular turnout was held Sunday afternoon on the old baseball grounds and 20 aspirants for the Bend Amateur Athletic Club team were out for the first workout.

Prospects for both a heavy and fast eleven look unusually good. New material of recent football experience has been enlisted. Turnouts three nights a week and Sunday afternoons will be held. Through the courtesy of the Bend Water, Light & Power Co., two large arc lights have been erected on poles on the grounds to facilitate night practices.

The spirit among the candidates is strong for a fast and well regulated team this year, with the view to getting games with strong outside elevens during the season. At a meeting of the candidates held after signal practice, H. S. Ketchum, formerly All-American center of Yale, and one of the best centers the Blue ever had, was elected captain-coach, and Carl A. Johnson, manager. Coach Ketchum will groom his men three nights a week and will go over them thoroughly Sunday afternoons.

Burns and Prineville both are anxious to obtain games with Bend and it may be possible to get games with The Dalles or clubs of other towns in the state.

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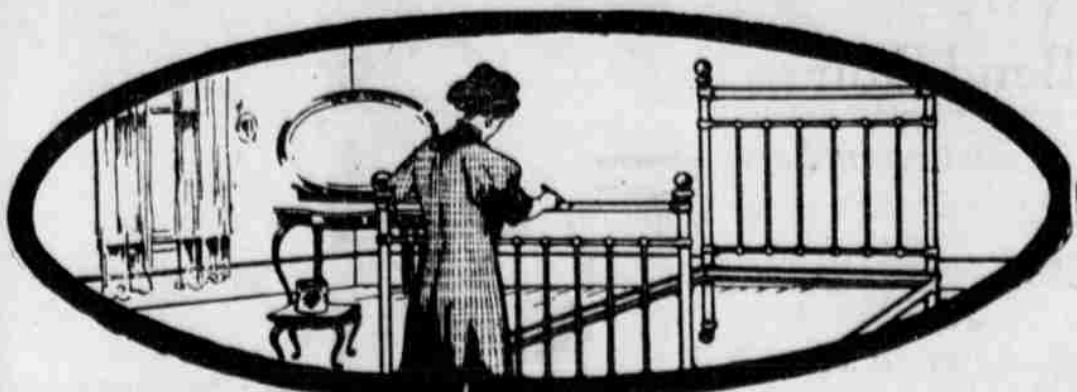
