**PENDING ORDINANCE PASSED.**  
The passage of an ordinance regulating the business of canvassing and peddling laws the chief business attended to by the council at last night's adjourned meeting. A high daily license fee is provided by the city, and severe penalties for its infringement are imposed. The council also ordered the preparation of an ordinance requiring the new street names and numbers. City Marshal Nixon was granted a two week's vacation, and City Engineer Gould's report of the Hawthorne avenue was read and adopted subject to the consent of property owners affected.

**GRANDSTAND PLANS COMPLETE.**  
Edward H. Keane this week completed the plans for the grandstand for the Bend Fair and Track Association. The stand will be 31 by 91 feet and will have a seating capacity for 500 persons. Work will start on the erection of the grandstand next week.

**WILL RUN AS INDEPENDENTS.**  
J. Allen Thompson, of Tumalo, will be a candidate for county school superintendent, and George S. Young, of Bend, will be a candidate for county surveyor, at the coming election, both running as independents. Petitions nominating them for office have been circulated in the past few days and will be filed by tomorrow, the last day on which filings may be made. Mr. Thompson was defeated by J. E. Myers for the regular Republican nomination by a small margin just spring.

**SCHOOL NOTES.**  
A reception to the freshman class of the high school was held on Friday at the Reid School. An address of welcome was given by Ruth Vandervort, president of the senior class to which E. Brewsterhouse, freshman president, responded. Superintendent Thorderson also addressed the meeting. Musical numbers were given and the freshmen tried out various stunts. Refreshments of punch and cookies were served.
