MR. WILSON WIELDED SMARTLY TO BEAR, PARTLY TO HOPE OF POLITICAL PROFIT. President Wilson called to the attention of the Senate of the Brotherhood and made to the effect to find out whether the House would be satisfied with or I could be supplied with without making further news.
