Guy E. Dobson road, viewer's report read a second time. Road accepted; ordered opened as public highway as soon as funds are available.

Crook County Fair Association—Order warrant drawn in favor of said Fair Association in sum of \$1,500 to apply on 1916 fair expenses.

Mathilda Rammin—Order granting widow's pension in sum of \$17.50 per month, beginning October 1, 1916. Clerk instructed to draw warrants accordingly.

Order estimating the amount to be raised by Crook county by direct taxation during the year 1917 to be a total sum of \$391,895, itemized as follows: (See itemized report). Further order setting Thursday, the 7th day of December, 1916, as time of hearing on said estimated budget, hearing to be held on said day at the hour of ten o'clock, in the county courtroom at Prineville, Oregon. Further order instructing Clerk to give proper notice thereof by publication in the official county newspaper, according to law, on Thursday, November 16, and on Thursday, November 23, 1916.
