LAIR THOMPSON BEATEN

PORTLAND, Nov. 16. The closest of the many close races in Tuesday's election was that for the state senate in the Seventeenth senatorial district, embracing Crook, Jefferson, Riamath and Lake counties Lair Thompson, of Lakeview, incumbent, and Republican, was defeated for resoluction by George T Haldwin of Riamath Falls, Democrat, by one vote. Word to this effect, based upon the final count, has been received home. ceived here from Senator Thompson, and is also carried by the Associated Press. Thompson won in Crook by a marrow margin, carried Jefferson comfortably, lost in Klamath heavily and apparently lost Lake slightly. Complete figures are not available
