

PARSLOW-GEORGE GO

Crack Portland Boxer to Be Seen Here Thanksgiving Night.

Frank Parslow, one of the crack middleweight boxers of Portland, who has had remarkable success on the Pacific Coast will meet Billy George at the Hippodrome Thanksgiving night, under the auspices of the Bend Athletic club, in a 10-round boxing contest.

Parslow has obtained one decision and one knockout over Valley Trambitis, of Portland, and two decisions over Al Summers, of Portland, who has just recently returned from a successful eastern tour. Parslow is said to be the best in his class on the Pacific Coast. George and Parslow will weigh in at 150 pounds at 4 p. m., before the match. In 68 contests Parslow has been defeated only once. Several fast preliminaries are being planned for the event.
