### HIGH SCHOOL STANDARDIZED

Having compiled all the requirements set down by the state school law, for the standardization of high schools, the state superintendent of public instruction, J. A. Churchill, has notified Superintendent Franklin Thordarson that the Bend High school has been placed on the list of accredited high schools of Oregon.

### RECORDER FILES REPORT

The sum of \$218 was collected by the city recorder in fines for violations of laws and ordinances, according to a report just filed with the council. In all there were 104 cases of law violation, the most profitable to the city being the 21 cases of drunkenness, on which the fines amounted to \$205. There have been 77 cases of violation of the vehicle ordinance. Other receipts of the recorder's office amount to \$283 for the sale of cemetery lots and building permits.
