Bounty Funds Enough.

J. N. Burgess, of Pendleton, member of the executive board of the National Woolgrowers' association, today announced that he taken up the matter with Speaker Stanfield and other members of the legislature. Until the people are given a chance to vote on the proposed missioner, amendment the legislature will be asked to retain the present bounty law, so that the work of exterminating the predatory animals may not be interrupted. The present law, which provides \$90,000 bounty money for the next two years, Mr. Burgens declared would be sufficient to pay \$2.50 bounty on coyotes. bounty at present is only \$1.50 a head.
