

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

(Continued from page 3.)

In the O'Kane Building in Bend on Friday, Feb. 9, 1917, at 10:00 o'clock A. M.

Bend, Oregon, Feb. 9th, 1917. County Court of Deschutes County, Oregon, met at the Council Chamber in the O'Kane Building, pursuant to adjournment, all members being present.

Meeting duly called to order at 10:00 o'clock A. M. by Wm. D. Barnes, County Judge.

In the Matter of Widows Pensions. This matter coming on to be heard, and it appearing to the Court from applications transferred from the County of Crook, that certain widows in Deschutes County entitled to pensions under the so-called Widows Pension Law have not been paid since December 13th, 1916, it is therefore

ORDERED, that the County Clerk issue and deliver to such widows, his warrants on the general fund in accordance with the applications on file.

Hattie Huntington, an Indigent. ORDERED, that the County Clerk issue warrants each month for \$10, payable to Hattie Huntington, an indigent woman.

Treasurer's Supplies. ORDERED, that the County Treasurer procure necessary receipt blanks and that 50 each of three forms presented be procured at this time.

District Attorney. A communication was presented by the District Attorney asking that one-half his stenographer's salary be paid by the County, in lieu of office rent. Continued.

Office Rooms. A communication received from the Deschutes Investment Company was presented, offering offices for the use of the County. Continued. Court Room.

A communication was received from the City Council of Bend, proposing joint use of the Council rooms by the City and County, the County to pay \$20.00, one half the rent paid per month. Clerk was instructed to offer said Council one-half for the reason that plans to also place the rooms at the disposal of the Superintendent of Schools have been abandoned.

The following joint resolutions of this Court, and the County Court of Crook County were presented, to-wit:

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR THE COUNTIES OF DESCHUTES AND CROOK.

In the Matter of the Collection of Taxes, Both Current and Delinquent. Joint Resolution by the Tax Collectors of the Counties.

WHEREAS, the joint county courts of the counties of Deschutes and Crook convened together at Prineville, Crook County, Oregon, on this 7th day of February, 1917, and having taken up and discussed the matter of the collection of taxes, both delinquent and current; it is hereby

Resolved and ordered, that the tax collector of the County of Deschutes proceed to collect the tax extended upon the current rolls for 1916 of Crook County, Oregon, on all property thereon lying and situate within the boundaries of the said County of Deschutes, and that he also proceed to collect all taxes that are now delinquent upon such property for the year 1915 as shown by the tax rolls of Crook County for the year 1915, and that in sending out statements of taxes due for the year 1916 as above, that he show on such statements the amount of the tax due and delinquent for the said year 1915, and by rubber stamp, or other method such as he may find convenient, give notice on such statement that all delinquent taxes for year prior to 1915 are payable to the tax collector of the County of Crook at Prineville, Oregon, and

That the tax collector of the County of Crook collect only such taxes on the current rolls for 1916 and such delinquent taxes as shown by the roll of 1915 upon property within, and which is located in the County of Crook, but that he collect taxes for all prior years upon all the property within both the counties of Deschutes and Crook by reason of the fact that Crook County holds judgments and certificates of delinquency for all taxes that became delinquent prior to the year 1915.

In the Matter of the Salary and Compensation of the County Agricultural Agent. Joint Resolution of the County Agricultural Agent.

WHEREAS, the County Courts of Deschutes and Crook Counties have met in joint session at Prineville, Oregon, on this 7th day of February, 1917, and having under consideration the matter of the employment and payment of the salary of a County Agricultural agent; it is hereby

RESOLVED and ordered, that a county agricultural agent be employed by the counties of Crook and Deschutes, jointly, and that he be paid the sum of \$1500 annually, of which sum Deschutes County shall contribute and pay three-fifths and the County of Crook shall contribute and pay two-fifths. Such payments to be audited and paid as other claims against the counties are paid.

This agreement to remain in full force and effect until such time as the County Courts of said counties may decide to annul said agreement and recall same.

In the Matter of the Payment of the Compensation and Traveling Expenses of the State Water Master. Joint Resolution of the State Water Master.

WHEREAS, the County Courts of the Counties of Deschutes and Crook have met in joint session on this 7th day of February, 1917, and having considered the matter of the payment of the compensation and expenses of the State Water Master and his deputy for the said two counties; it is hereby

RESOLVED and ordered, that the Water Master be paid \$50.00 each

month throughout the year by Deschutes County and \$50.00 each month throughout the year by Crook County all expenses and extra deputy hire for which said counties may be liable by law to be paid by each county, share and share alike, upon presentation of proper statements verified as provided by law to each of said counties, until such time as this agreement may be set aside.

The said three joint resolutions were then read to the Court, whereupon it was

ORDERED, that said joint resolutions, duly signed by the County Judges and County Commissioners of the Counties of Crook and Deschutes, and now on file in this Court, be and the same are hereby ratified and approved.

Justice Bond. ORDERED, that the bond of Earle Benton, as Justice of the Peace for Terrebonne precinct be referred to the District Attorney for his approval as to form.

McKenzie Road. Petition of District Forester for formal application by this Court, and agreement to provide funds, was continued.

Redmond Road Payroll. The payroll of W. J. Buckley, showing the amounts due from this Court, as co-operative road work, was considered, whereupon, the following claims shown on said payroll were allowed, and the Clerk instructed to issue warrants therefor.

On motion the Court adjourned to meet at 2:00 P. M. of this day. Court reconvened at 2:00 P. M., February 9th, 1917, all members being present.

Peterson Road. A petition signed by A. Johnson, et al. was presented asking that the fences now constructed across the Peterson road in Tp. 16, Range 11 be removed.

ORDERED, that proper notice be given to all persons obstructing such highway with fences, that such fences must be removed therefrom by April 1st, 1917.

District Attorney's Stenographer. ORDERED, that the District Attorney be allowed \$30.00 per month for clerical assistance, in lieu of office rent.

Water in County Roads. A communication was received from the Alfalfa Development Club, protesting that certain persons permit water from irrigating ditches to stand in the public highways. The matter was discussed at length, after which the Clerk was instructed to advise said club that the Court would proceed to the abatement of such practice as soon as possible.

Treasurer's Books. The County Treasurer was instructed to order necessary account books, after obtaining prices thereon and obtaining the approval of the County Judge for such prices.

On motion the claim of Geo. S. Young for \$53.13 was allowed, and the Clerk instructed to issue his warrant in payment.

Plat of Manzanita. Now presented for approval and record the plat of Manzanita, an addition to Bend, Oregon, which plat has been duly approved by the County Surveyor, County Assessor, and Sheriff, and it appearing to the Court that said plat is made to conform to the requirements of law, therefore

ORDERED, that said plat of Manzanita be and the same is hereby approved.

Rodent Bounties. ORDERED, that the Clerk be and he hereby is instructed to issue his warrant for \$115.00, payable to R. A. Blanchard, County Agriculturalist, for the purpose of purchasing poison for the use of the several rodent extermination clubs within the County.

Stationery. ORDERED, that the County Judge be and he is hereby authorized to purchase necessary stationery supplies for the several offices for the County.

Safe. ORDERED, that the County Judge purchase one metal safe for the use of the County, and that he negotiate with the State Desert Land Board for the purchase of the old safe at Tumalo for the use of the Sheriff.

On motion the Court adjourned to meet Tuesday, February 13th, 1917 at 10:00 o'clock A. M.
