

DRAFT REGISTRATION IS GROWING BRISKER

Signing Up by Mail Commences—Many Seek to Register in Advance, Says Deputy Clerk.

(From Monday's Daily.) Registration for draft by non-residents of Deschutes county and by residents who will not be in the county on June 5 is continuing briskly, Miss Eleanor Whitmore, deputy county clerk stated today. Seventeen were registered Saturday night after office hours, and nearly as many signed up today. A number are registering by mail, Miss Whitmore says. Although it has been definitely stated and repeated that June 5 is the date on which permanent residents should register at their precincts, many are seeking to sign up in advance at the clerk's office, under the impression that they must register now, or run the risk of arrest. Early registration, it is pointed out by Miss Whitmore, is only for those who will be unable to appear in person at their home precincts on the specified day.

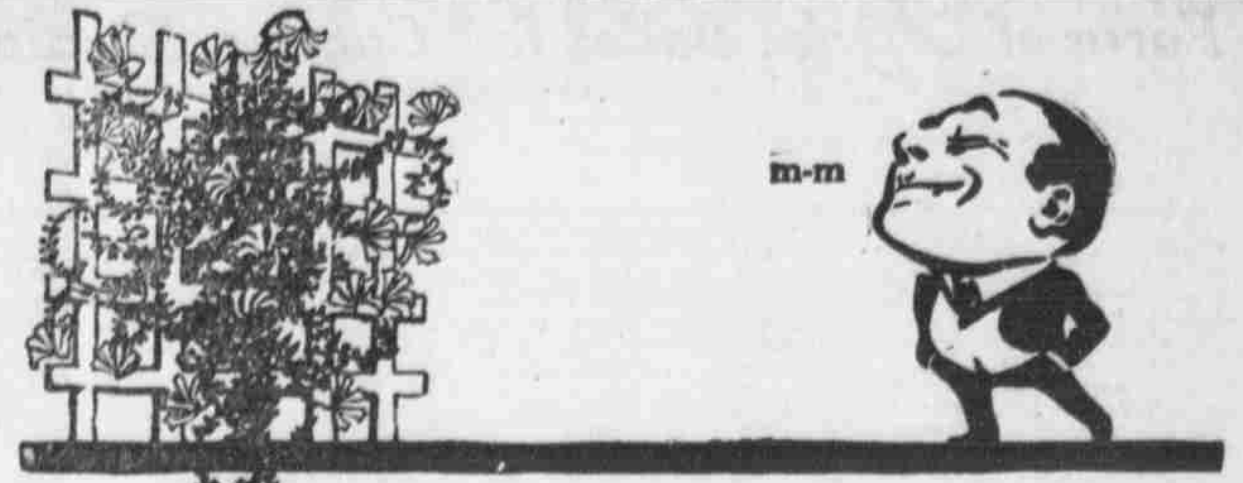
