

News of the World in Brief

The commencing of one of the most savage drives yet started by the Allied troops, on the Flanders front, the examination of the thousands of young men throughout the United States as a semi-final step to calling out the first unit of the National army, and the passing of the food control bill in the U. S. Senate, providing for a food dictator in this country, stand out as the events of most importance in the world's news of the week.

German newspapers, and the gradual stiffening of the Russian defense are noted. Russia will have the direct support of the United States, for the next American troops to go abroad will be sent to the Slav frontier, while others will aid the Italians in their campaign. Argentina is preparing to mobilize her army of 100,000 men against the Teutonic powers.

Labor troubles are constituting so serious a hindrance to the industrial mobilization of the nation for war, that a federal commission was appointed to adjust difficulties. A general strike aimed especially at the northwest, is being threatened at I. W. W. headquarters in retaliation for the hanging of Frank Little, agitator, in Butte.

Preparations in Washington are being rapidly made to launch the second Liberty Loan bond campaign to raise \$3,000,000,000 more for war purposes. The drive will start November 15, and the issuing of \$1,000,000,000 of short time treasury certificates will meet immediate needs. These are already over-subscribed.
