

NO WAR RAISE ON BEND BRICK

A. H. HORN EXPECTS TO ADD PRESSED BRICK MACHINERY TO EQUIPMENT OF HIS ESTABLISHMENT.

A. H. Horn, of the Bend Brick Company, is a bit proud of the fact that the products he turns out, namely, Bend-made brick, are among the few whose prices have not been increased, war or no war.

"This season we will manufacture close to 3,000,000 brick," said Mr. Horn, who was intown yesterday, "and we are ready to increase our output just as fast as the market needs more."

The local plant is now operating the largest type brick machine that is made, which is being utilized to turn out about 45,000 brick a day. The crew for the machine, exclusive of the burning and hauling departments, employs 22 men.

Next spring, says Mr. Horn, the company will probably install a pressed brick plant. Experiments are now being made in this direction and very satisfactory results are being secured. With this addition the local concern would be able to provide everything used in the line of brick in the most modern buildings.

J. D. DONOVAN DRIVES AUTO OVER A CLIFF

Drops Through Air When He Turns
Out for Horse—Car Unhurt, But
Shoulder Is Dislocated.

Driving his auto over the edge of a cliff while on the Tillamook road last week, J. D. Donovan, of the Bend Hospital, received a badly dislocated shoulder as his only injury, has returned to Bend. Overhanging grass on the edge of the road appeared to be growing from firm ground, Mr. Donovan explained, but when he turned out for a frightened horse, he found nothing but air under him. Others in the car were uninjured, and after righting the machine, Mr. Donovan drove back to Portland, not realizing until after a medical examination, that his own hurts amounted to anything more than bruises.

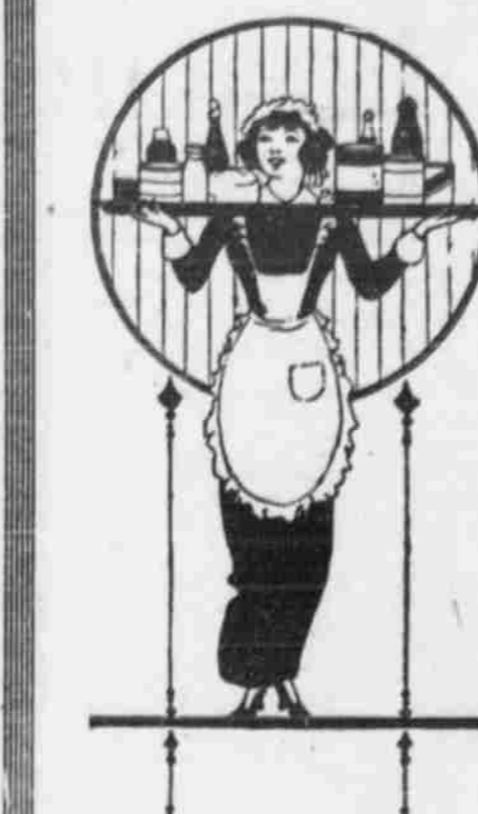
