SIGN PETITION FOR DISTRICT

MORE THAN 100 NAMES OF LAND-OWNERS APPENDED TO REQUEST, COMPLETE IRRIGATIONISTS' FIRST MOVE.

(From Saturday's Daily.)
With more than 100 signatures of land owners on the C. G. I. irrigation system secured, the first step toward the organization of an irrigation district in Deschutes and Crook counties was completed today. The petition prepared by H. H. De Armond and Claude McCulloch, of Portland, was circulated by J. Alton Thompson, and more than fills all legal requirements. In fact more than the 100 names could easily have been obtained had it not been thought advisable to get the matter under way as soon as possible, Mr. De Armond explained this morning.
Notice of the petition will be given for four weeks' time, after which the petition itself will be presented to the county court. An order setting the time for an election for organization purposes will be the next step required of the court, and with the election the district will come into being.
Mr. De Armond believes that the entire procedure will not take more than 10 weeks.

TUMALO BOY IS NOW IN FRANCE

CARL D. MARION, OF FIELD ARTILLERY, IN ACTIVE SERVICE IN EUROPE, LETTER TO HIS MOTHER SHOWS.

The first Deschutes county boy to go into active service in Europe with the American expeditionary force, as far as is known, is Carl D. Marion, of Battery D, Fifth Field Artillery, who left his home in Tumalo to join the army shortly after war was declared between the United States and Germany.
His mother, Mrs. E. P. Marion, has just received her first letter from him since he crossed the ocean. "I just received my first mail in France yesterday," he writes. "Five letters all told. We arrived safely and are having a dandy time. I like the country fine. It is something like Southern Oregon and California."
Because of the censorship, young Marion was unable to go into details in his letter. It was written some time in August, the exact date being also omitted. The letter is written on Y. M. C. A. stationery with the printed heading, "On active service with the American expeditionary force."
