The operation of the additional band will mean the increasing of the plant's capacity 33 1-3 per cent, making a total of approximately 360,000 feet a day, working two shifts. In the neighborhood of 150 more men will be employed, the increase coming in the woods, in the addition of a fourth saw crew, and in extra men needed to handle the augmented product in the yards. In other branches of the big plant there will be no change, as the plans originally contemplated the use of four bands.

Officials to Visit. The Shevlin-Hixon Company mill started in Bend in March, 1916, with two bands, and a few months later a second twin mill was built, housing a third band and allowing room for a fourth. While the new equipment will add materially to the amount of timber removed from the forests of Central Oregon, it is pointed out that the company's holdings are so extensive that the cut will be continued undiminished for a lifetime.

The Bend plant will receive a visit of inspection from high officials of the company early next month, Mr. McCann states.

FORD AGENCY HAS PLACED EIGHT CARS






