

# COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

**Bend, Oregon, August 14, 1917.**—The County Court met in the council room in the O'Kane building, pursuant to adjournment, and no business coming up for consideration at this time, court adjourned to meet August 27.

**Bend, Oregon, August 27, 1917.**—The County Court met in the council room in the O'Kane building, pursuant to adjournment, Judge Barnes and Commissioner Smith present.

The meeting was called to order by the County Judge.

In the Matter of the County Hospital:

This matter coming up for hearing, and bids for hospital service having been called and advertised for, the following bids were submitted:

Mrs. I. M. Fry, Redmond, Oregon, Tubercular cases, per patient, \$16 per week; all other cases, per patient, \$14 per week. Mrs. Kate E. Warner, Bend, Oregon: All patients, \$29 per week.

After discussion the matter was continued.

In the Matter of continuing the work of the Agricultural Agent for the year 1918:

Ordered that an agreement be entered into with the Extension Department of the Oregon Agricultural College and the County Court of Crook County, whereby Deschutes County will appropriate \$700, and Crook County \$500, to which will be added \$1200 state money, and \$1000 federal money, making a total of \$3400, with which to conduct the agricultural work in Crook and Deschutes Counties for the year 1918.

Steel safe for County Treasurer: It was ordered that there be purchased from J. C. Rhodes one all steel fire safe cabinet for the County Treasurer, purchase price to be \$374 f. o. b. Bend.

Steel safe for County Assessor: It was ordered that there be purchased from J. C. Rhodes one all steel fire safe cabinet for the County Assessor, purchase price to be \$341 f. o. b. Bend.

No further business coming up for consideration at this time, on motion duly made and seconded, court adjourned to meet Wednesday, August 29, 1917.

**Bend, Oregon, August 29, 1917.**—The County Court met in the council room in the O'Kane building, pursuant to adjournment, Judge Barnes and Commissioner Smith present.

The meeting was called to order by the County Judge at 10 o'clock a. m.

In the Matter of a County Jail:

This matter coming up at this time for consideration, the most of the meeting was spent in considering the plans for a county jail. Mr. A. C. Peck, a representative of the Pauly Jail Company, being present.

In the Matter of Disinfection of County Schools:

This matter coming up for consideration, it was ordered that the County Physician be instructed to supervise the disinfection of the Bend schools, and any other schools in the county wherein contagious diseases are known to have existed during the past year, the various school districts bearing the expenses of the disinfecting and fumigation.

No further business coming up at this time, on motion duly made and seconded, court adjourned.

It is remembered that at a regular meeting of the County Court of Deschutes County, Oregon, convened in the council room in the O'Kane building, September 5, 1917, the following members were present:

The meeting was called to order by the County Judge, whereupon the following proceedings were made a record, to-wit:

Now at this time the matter of County Jail again coming up for consideration, a contract was presented by the Pauly Jail Building Company, of St. Louis, Mo., for steel cells complete. The contract for \$4,639.55, was duly approved and accepted by the County Judge on behalf of the County Court.

It was ordered that the road roller belonging to the Central Oregon Irrigation Company be purchased at \$90.00.

The matter of claims against the county coming up for consideration, it was ordered that claims numbered 705 to 737 inclusive, 739 to 754 inclusive, 764 to 801 inclusive, No. 803 to 804 inclusive, be and the same are hereby allowed and the clerk instructed to issue his warrants in payment thereof.

No further business coming up for consideration, on motion duly made and seconded, court adjourned to meet Wednesday, September 12, 1917.

**Bend, Oregon, September 12, 1917.**—The County Court met in the council room in the O'Kane building at 10 o'clock a. m., pursuant to adjournment, Judge Barnes and Commissioner Smith present.

The meeting was called to order by the County Judge.

A petition from the Eastern Star Grange was presented, asking for an appropriation of \$25 for premiums for their annual festival to be held October 5.

Ordered, that such an appropriation be made, provided that the money so appropriated be used only on exhibits intended to stimulate increased food production, and that before the money is paid over, a report shall be presented by the Grange to the Court, showing how the premiums were awarded.

In the Matter of the Brickyard-Tumalo Road:

Ordered, that there be appropriated for the purpose of repairing and cinderling this road, and repairing the Tumalo bridge thereon, an amount not to exceed \$800 to be expended, dollar for dollar with money to be raised by A. H. Horne, A. J. Kronert, et al.; and that the unexpended balance of the \$600 formerly appropriated be also expended in said repairing and cinderling, it being understood that the necessary culverts along said road be built by the parties interested, without expense to the county, and that the work be done under the supervision and direction of A. H. Horne.

In the matter of the appropriation formerly made for the purpose of providing funds for premiums offered by the Bend Flower and Vegetable Show, a report being at this time submitted showing that \$35.65 was paid in premiums on vegetables and fruits:

It is ordered that a warrant for \$35.65 be drawn, payable to Mrs. E. M. Thompson, secretary and treasurer of said show.

J. H. Dittmore, of Redmond, Oregon, having filed his resignation as Justice of the Peace of the Redmond precinct, and a petition signed by J. A. Wilcox, D. G. Burdick, M. A. Canning and W. B. Dargatz asking the appointment of G. G. Sedgwick, having been presented, it is hereby

Ordered that said G. G. Sedgwick be appointed to fill the vacancy upon the furnishing of and approval of the regular bond.

Ordered that Clerk J. H. Haner be authorized to purchase three office chairs and a flat top table. Also to have shelves built under the counter in his new office.

In the Matter of Water Franchise, Pringle Falls:

The petition of C. W. Riddell was presented for a franchise to lay water pipes in the streets of Pringle Falls, and upon discussion and consideration it was ordered that same be referred to the district attorney for his approval.

No further business coming up for consideration at this time, on motion duly made and seconded, meeting adjourned to meet Wednesday, September 19, 1917.

**Bend, Oregon, September 19, 1917.**—The County Court met in the council room in the O'Kane building at 10 a. m., pursuant to adjournment, all members being present.

The meeting was called to order by the County Judge.

It was ordered that Assessor Mullerkey be authorized to purchase blue prints in duplicate of townships and additions, from D. H. Peoples at 60 cents per pair, with the understanding that other prints will be furnished at 10 cents each.

Ordered that inasmuch as additional work has been thrown upon the Sheriff's office by reason of his being a member of the Exemption Board, \$25 a month be appropriated for additional help in his office, beginning October 1.

Ordered, that Supervisor F. B. Wilson be instructed to install culverts and make hill passable on the S. R. Hoch road, the settlers co-operating on a 50-50 basis.

Petition for Water Franchise, Pringle Falls:

This petition again being presented and same being approved by the district attorney, as being in due form, the petition was granted.

The bond of George G. Sedgwick, Justice of the Peace for the Redmond Precinct was submitted and approved.

Ordered that H. C. Hartman be appointed to represent the County Court in the Oregon Patriotic Service League.

Ordered that the County Clerk be authorized to purchase a Bond Record, a Mortgage Record and the necessary binders for same.

The matter of claims against the county coming up for consideration, it was ordered that claims numbered 705 to 819 inclusive, and \$21 to \$31 inclusive, be and the same are hereby allowed, and the clerk instructed to issue his warrants in payment thereof.

No further business coming up for consideration, on motion duly made and seconded, court adjourned to meet Wednesday, September 26, 1917.

# ROAD REACHES MOUNTAIN TOP

**RANGERS COMPLETE THE WORK —TRIP TO PEAK IS RECOMMENDED—AMATEURS ADVISED TO STAY AWAY.**

Autos may now ascend to the summit of Broken Top Mountain, according to word brought yesterday from the ranger station there. The work of constructing some semblance of a roadway was completed yesterday by Rangers B. F. Smith and Forest Guard A. W. Palmer and an automobile went up the entire way to the state cabin on the divide. The trip is not recommended for an inexperienced driver as the climb is a steep one and the road is little more than a trail.

Fishermen have taken autos up in the vicinity previous to the completion of the road but it was not passable for the average tourist on many of the hills. Now these can be negotiated if the driver is willing to unload his passengers on two or three of the steepest pitches.

The trip is about 23 or 24 miles altogether and can easily be accomplished as a Sunday drive. The view at the summit is said to be extremely worth while, as it includes the mountains and lakes in the surrounding country on both sides. The elevation is 7000 feet.

Forestry officials, who have made the trip have no desire to mislead motorists into believing that they will find a paved highway running straight up the mountain, and caution those who receive such an impression to stay at home. Driving is rough but it can be done.

# FALLING TREE CAUSES DEATH

**DAN DRAGICH PINNED UNDER TIMBER WHILE AT WORK IN SHEVLIN-HIXON CAMP THIS MORNING.**

A falling tree in the woods near the Shevlin-Hixon Camp 3 was the cause of the death of Dan Dragich this morning between 7 and 8 o'clock. The deceased was a timber faller and was cutting a large tree when the top of another pine and knocked a piece of the older one loose. Dragich was standing with his back turned to the dead tree when his brother-in-law, Steve Tavick, who was working with him, saw the limb coming and shouted a warning. Instead of stepping aside the man stooped and was caught squarely on the back and pinned under branch, causing instant death.

Mr. Dragich was an Austrian and his family is well known here. He is survived by a brother, Mike Dragich, and a sister, Mrs. Steve Tavick.
