

BEND VICTOR IN FOOTBALL GAME

PRINEVILLE HIGH SCHOOL LOSES TO TUNE OF 40-7—TWO LOCAL BOYS KNOCKED OUT DURING THE CONTEST.

By a score of 40 to 7, Bend high school carried off the first game of the football season played in Prineville Saturday afternoon. This is the first time since 1914 that the Bend school eleven has defeated the Crook county players. A return game will take place in Bend a week from Saturday.

Scoring done by the local team was fairly evenly divided throughout the game. Two Bend boys were injured during the course of the contest, Eugene Wright sustaining a badly sprained ankle which will lay him up for several weeks. Delmar Young was knocked out when he got under a number of the Prineville players in a rush. He was unable to play during the remainder of the game, but has since recovered.
