## CHANGE ANNOUNCED BY F. S. STANLEY.

Company May Favor District Now Proposed, He Says—Anxious to Finish Work That Returns May Be Realized.

(From Tuesday's Daily.)

That the Central Oregon Irrigation Company will hereafter maintain an office in Bend became known this week when F. S. Stanley, president of the company, announced that he would move his desk at once from the company's offices in Deschutes and take space with Harrison Latham at the corner of Oregon and Wall streets. For some years past the company's offices have been in Deschutes, where they were moved from Bend, and the general office will still be maintained there.

Information concerning the change was given out by Mr. Stanley on his return from Portland yesterday.

Referring to the proposal of the company to irrigate new lands in the Powell Butte section and the settlers' petition for the formation of an irrigation district which is to come before the county court on Wednesday, Mr. Stanley said that the company was not averse to a large district and might favor the district now proposed. Continuing, Mr. Stanley said:

"We have not been taken into the counsel of Mr. De Armond and associates in the matter of forming the district and as we would appear to be interested both financially and for the good of the country should know something of the plans. The law is very plain in some matters relative to the district, but as we have not gone into the matter as deep as we will as soon as our attorneys get the time, we cannot say at this time what action we will take in the formation of the district.

**Sees Good in District.**

"I will say this. That the company would like to finish up the work and get through and get some returns from its investment. The agitation in the formation of a district will no doubt result in some good, and, as before stated, the company may assist and favor the district when the details are fully explained. I personally feel that Mr. De Armond does not understand the petition as submitted to the Land Board by the people of the Powell Butte section or he would not have been quoted as stated in the Weekly Bulletin of October 25.

"Mr. De Armond objects and says it is our move, which is not, as the owners of dry lands in the section came to us and asked us to submit some plan, which we did, and if any better plan can be suggested to water that rich section, we would like to be advised. The people were certainly unanimous in asking the Land Board to look into the matter.

**Predicts General Benefit.**

"As to the extension of the North Canal, in which he infers that there would not be water available. That asking the Desert Land Board to look point is brought out in the petition into the matter, and certainly the money could not be raised and the project completed if the water is not available. The water in the river should be used where it will be put to the most beneficial use, and certainly Bend and vicinity could not complain of the building of the North Canal, for it will add many thousand acres to the farming section adjacent to Bend. Redmond could not complain for it will put under irrigation the barren waste between the river bed and Redmond, and the Powell Butte section could not complain as it would make that a close compact section."

## MANY HOUSES STILL WITHOUT NUMBERS

Fully One-Third of Residents Within Mail Delivery District Fail to Heed Order.

Bend residents who have failed to number their houses are now the sole ones responsible for the delay in securing a free mail delivery, according to Postmaster Henry B. Ford. Fully one-third of the dwellings within the district which would be served by carriers are still unprovided with numbers, he says, and a favorable inspector's report cannot be expected until this is done, he says.

Notice was given approximately two months ago by City Engineer Robert B. Gould, after the completion of walks throughout the district affected, but only a few houses have been numbered since that time.

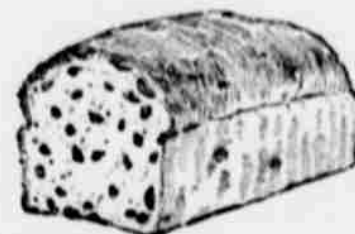
