COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

Bend, Oregon, December 24, 1917. The County Court met in the court house at 10 o'clock a. m., pursuant to adjournment. Judge Barnes, Commissioners Smith and Mackintosh being present. The meeting was called to order by the County Judge.

In the Matter of the Organization of the Central Oregon Irrigation District:

This matter coming on for hearing at this time, same being the time fixed by law for the canvassing of votes cast in the election, it was found that 193 votes were cast for the Irrigation District and 81 votes cast against same, and as same is more than three-fifths of the votes cast, the Irrigation District is declared organized.

It is also ordered that J. Alton Thompson, Alvin Riggs and James G. McGuffie are appointed directors at large, as they received the three highest votes for same.

No further business coming up for consideration at this time, court was adjourned until 8:00 p. m. this date, Bend, Oregon, December 24, 1917. The County Court met in the court house at 2:00 p. m. this date, pursuant to adjournment, same members present as at morning session.

The meeting was called to order by the County Judge.

Fire Patrol Levy: The County Court of Deschutes County, Oregon, hereby levies a tax of one and one-tenth cents per acre on the list as received from the Fire Patrol Association, for the year 1917 and the County Assessor is hereby instructed to extend the same on the 1917 tax roll.

No further business coming up for consideration at this time, on motion duly made and seconded, court adjourned to meet December 28, 1917. Bend, Oregon, December 28, 1917. The County Court met in the court room at 2 o'clock p. m., pursuant to adjournment, Judge Barnes and Commissioner Mackintosh being present.

The meeting was called to order by the County Judge.

Claims: The matter of claims against the county coming up for consideration, same were audited, and it was ordered that Claims No. 1418 to 1444 inclusive, as shown on page 48 of the Docket of Claims be and the same are hereby allowed, and the clerk is instructed to issue his warrants in payment thereof.

No further business coming up for consideration at this time, court adjourned.

The regular session of the County Court convened in the court room at 10:00 a. m., January 2, 1918, the following members being present: County Judge W. D. Barnes, Commissioner L. E. Smith, Clerk J. H. Haner, Sheriff S. E. Roberts.

Claims: The matter of claims against the county coming up for consideration, same were audited, and it was ordered that Claims No. 1445 to 1510 inclusive, and No. 1512 to 1582, as shown on pages 49, 50, 51 and 52 of the Docket of Claims, be and the same are hereby allowed, and the clerk is instructed to issue his warrant in payment thereof.

K. Nelson Road:
 This matter being presented, it was ordered that O. M. Swanson be deputized to open the K. Nelson road in Road District No. 21, and ordered to proceed with the work.

The application of W. J. Buckley, of Redmond, as road master for Deschutes county, was continued.

The request of Geo. S. Roberts, for duplicate warrant to be issued, to cover one lost, was granted, provided said Roberts file guarantee that the original will not be presented for payment at a later date.

County Surveyor:
 The resignation of George S. Young as county surveyor accepted, and Frank H. May appointed as his successor, with the understanding that should George S. Young return during this term of office, he shall be re-appointed.

Terrebonne Mutual Telephone Association:
 The petition for right of way for telephone line of the Terrebonne Mutual Telephone Association was considered at this time, and the same was referred to the District Attorney for his approval.

Bend Bulletin, Official Newspaper:
 There being no application for the appointment, other than the Bend Bulletin, as the official newspaper for Deschutes county, and it appearing that the Weekly Bulletin has the largest circulation of any paper published in the county, said paper was designated as the official newspaper, at a compensation of \$39 per month for the publication of all county court proceedings and all official notices of this court, and all the official business of county officers.

County Road:
 Resolution for locating a county road, tributary to the H. B. Ford county road, in Sec. 30, Twp 18, S. R. 13, E. W. M., was presented at this time. Resolution was passed and copies of same ordered posted according to law.

No further business coming up for consideration at this time, on motion duly made and seconded, court adjourned to meet January 9, 1918.
