

# COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

Bend, Oregon, January 23, 1918. The County Court met in the court house, pursuant to adjournment, Judge Barnes and Commissioner Mackintosh being present.

The meeting was called to order by the County Judge, whereupon the following proceedings were made a record.

**Claims:** The matter of claims against the county coming up for consideration, same were audited, and it was ordered that Claims No. 1615 to 1642 inclusive, No. 1645 to 1671 inclusive, as shown on pages 54 and 55 of the Docket of Claims, be and the same are hereby allowed, and the clerk is instructed to issue his warrants in payment thereof.

**District Attorney:** Warrant in the sum of \$250 ordered drawn in favor of Vernon A. Forbes, as special counsel to assist District Attorney, in the county division suit.

**Road Roller:** It was ordered that a Monarch Combination road roller be purchased from the Howard-Cooper Corporation, total cost \$3800. One-half of said purchase price to be paid April 1, 1918, balance to be paid April 1, 1919.

No further business coming up for consideration at this time, on motion duly made and seconded, court adjourned to meet January 30, 1918.

Bend, Oregon, December 30, 1918. The adjourned session of the County Court of Deschutes County met at 10 o'clock a. m. in the court house, there being present Judge W. D. Barnes, Commissioners A. L. Mackintosh and L. E. Smith.

The meeting was called to order by the County Judge.

**K. Nelson Road:** It was moved by Commissioner Smith, and seconded by Commissioner Mackintosh, that O. M. Swanson be instructed to discontinue the opening of the K. Nelson road, until receiving further instructions from the county court. Carried, Judge Barnes voting negatively.

**Registration Cards, Deschutes County:** It was ordered that County Clerk Haner be directed to bring mandamus proceedings against the county clerk of Crook county, to get possession of the registration cards now on file in the office of the county clerk of Crook county, of all registered voters who reside in what is now Deschutes county.

**In the Matter of the Transfer of Tumalo Project Records from Crook County to Deschutes County:** It is ordered that the county clerk of Deschutes county be and he is hereby directed to take all necessary steps for the transferring of the Tumalo Irrigation Project records, now on file with the county clerk of Crook county, from the said county clerk's office of Crook county, to Deschutes county, and the said county clerk of Deschutes county is further ordered to take the necessary steps to have transferred from Crook county, any and all books, volumes, records, certificates and other instruments effecting or relating to real property in Deschutes county, to Deschutes county.

**In the Matter of the Collection of Money Owed to Deschutes County, from Crook County, arising from the Settlement made between the two Counties in the Joint Session Held:** It is ordered that the county treasurer of Deschutes county forthwith take the necessary steps to collect that portion of said money belonging to Deschutes county, and he is empowered and authorized to take all necessary steps to carry out the provisions of this order.

**Adding Machine for County Offices:** The following letter having been submitted:

January 25, 1918. "To the Honorable County Court of Deschutes County, Oregon. Gentlemen, We, the County Treasurer and County Assessor of said county, hereby represent that an adding machine is necessary for the proper conducting of our respective offices and hereby request that the same be purchased for our joint use.

CLYDE M. M'KAY, County Treasurer, W. T. MULLARKEY, County Assessor." After due discussion and consideration, it was ordered that a Burroughs Adding Machine, style 329, as per contract herewith, be ordered at the price of \$225.

**Jail Building:** This matter is now presented by Mr. John H. Rausch, construction superintendent of the Pauly Jail Building company. As the jail has been completed according to specifications and plans on file with contract, it was

Ordered that said jail building be accepted by the county and that the payment of \$4639.55 be made according to the terms of the contract, which are within 30 days after completion.

It is further ordered that warrant be made payable to the First National Bank, and that they be instructed to issue draft in amount of \$4639.55, payable to the Pauly Jail Building Company.

**Appointment of Road Master:** It was ordered that Frank May be appointed ex-officio road master, to act until such time as a permanent road master is appointed for Deschutes county.

**Scalp Bounties:** Report showing amount of scalp bounties paid by the county clerk during the past six months, received and ordered filed. Total amount paid from July 1, to December 31, 1917, \$1007.50; largest amount paid on any one day being \$151.00.

**Troy Trailer, Hodson Feenaughty Co.:** This bill being presented at this time, after discussion, it was ordered that same be continued until April 1, 1918, at which time same shall be paid in full, with interest from Dec. 19, 1917, as stated in contract; cost of trailer being \$2185.50.

**Resignation of County Commissioner:** The resignation of County Commissioner L. E. Smith, was presented at this time.

C. H. Miller, of Redmond, Oregon, was nominated by A. L. Mackintosh, and on motion made and seconded, was duly elected to fill Mr. Smith's unexpired term.

**Claims:** The matter of claims against the county coming up for consideration, same were audited, and it was ordered that Claims No. 1672 to 1678 inclusive, No. 1680 to 1686 inclusive, No. 1689 and 1690, as shown on page 56 of the Docket of Claims, be and the same are hereby allowed, and the clerk is instructed to issue his warrants in payment thereof.

It was ordered that \$4512.36 be transferred from the General Fund to the Road Fund, to take care of County Road warrants issued from January 1, 1918, to January 30, 1918, inclusive.
