### ENTIRE COUNTY NOW WHEATLESS

was adopted and signed by those present:

"Whereas, At a meeting of the retail flour dealers held in Bend, Oregon, on May 31, 1918, it has been unanimously voted that the dealers present or represented, will make no retail sales of wheat flour between now and August 1st, except to hospitals, bakeries or logging camps.

"We, the undersigned, hereby expressly do become parties to such resolution or agreement.

"Be it further resolved that all merchants who now have flour in stock will invoice the same within four days, and that said invoice will be tendered to the county food administration to be forwarded to the government.

It is, however, to a large extent left to the discretion of the food administrator's office whether or not they are to be recognized, and if a special order from the state offices places them on an equality with the logging camps they will be included.
