FARIS LIKES LIFE AT MARE ISLAND

(From Tuesday's Daily.) Mrs. R. S. Faris of this city has recently received a letter from Mr. Faris, who joined the Marines through the local office here under Sergeant Brooks, and who is now located at the Mare Island training station. He says: "We have arrived safely on the Island, but it will be a few days before we take the final exams. This is a mighty clean and nice place to be in and I think I am going to like it fine. I have been in the detention camp ever since I arrived and do not know just how long we will be held here. We take a slight examination every day. "There is a fine bunch of boys here and the food is very good. We will not get our uniforms until after the final exams. There is such a bunch of boys coming every day and about 200 are now waiting to take the exams." Mr. Faris states further that there are movies at the camp, and that on the day following his writing, June 3, a ball game was played, supposedly between teams chosen from the men in training.

WATER MASTER JOINS THE SPRUCE DIVISION

(From Friday's Daily.) Harry I. Kennard, water master for Deschutes, Jefferson and Crook counties, with headquarters at Prineville, is in the city today and states that he has been tendered the position as equipment man for the government in the spruce division, and will leave on Saturday, June 22, for Raymond, Washington, where he is to be stationed. Mr. Kennard is not yet certain whether he will be enlisted in the army of spruce division workers or will remain in civilian life, the only orders received by him being those to report for military duty. He is now making an effort to have some one engaged in his place as water master.
