OF 42-36 OVER REDMOND HIGH SCHOOL IN HARD, SPECTACU-LAR CONTEST.


(From Saturday's Daily." In a fast, spectacular game, the Bend high school basketball team took the Redmond quintette into camp last night, winning by 42-36. The contest was staged at the athletic club gymnasium, and after the game a dancing party was given in honor of the visiting team.

The local players showed a remarkable gain in team work and were strengthened by placing Ed Brosterhous at center. It was his first appearance this season in a league game, but he found the basket five times during the evening. Sanders of Bend was high point winner for both teams, scoring 20 in goals and fouls, while Coyner and Helfrich each contributed six points.

On the visiting team Burmaster, forward, and Tuck, center, knocked down 14 and 12, respectively, and Tuck in particular should be mentioned as ranking with Sanders as one of the stars of the game. Tall, strong and fast, he was altogether too much for Hauck to guard with two points and Doty eight.

Fouls were abundant during the early part of the second half, but were due largely to the hard, fast style of playing. Altercations beficials, were frequent, and resulted eventually in Reynolds being forbidden to step within the side lines. It was anybody's game during the entire contest, Bend leading by a second half the visitors played the locals off their feet, taking a substantial lead which was only overcome when the Bend boys developed an uncanny accuracy in locating the basket.


