Withdrawal of 80,000 Acres From Segregation Points to Early Irrigation Activities

Indications that the federal reclamation service is making preparations for extensive irrigation work in this section are given in the announcement made this morning that some 80,000 acres lying east and northeast of Bend had been withdrawn from entry.

According to the plats received by United States Commissioner H. C. Ellis, who was informed of the matter by the land office at The Dalles, the lands embraced in the withdrawal are those included in the so-called Benham Falls segregation.

The land was first segregated about 12 years ago and included in the Carey act project of the Central Oregon Irrigation Co., the plan being to water it by a diversion at Benham falls, from which it received its name as the Benham Falls segregation.

NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS.

Taxes for the current year will now shortly be due. In paying taxes look up the description of the property on which you wish to pay taxes.

April 5 is the last date on which the first half of the 1919 taxes can be paid without interest.

October 5 is the last date on which the second half of the 1919 taxes can be paid without interest.

Interest shall be charged on any tax or half of a tax not paid when due at the rate of one per cent. per month or fraction of a month until paid.

All taxes not paid by the 5th day of October become delinquent and on November 5 a penalty of 5 per cent. is charged and collected in addition to the interest.
