

OLD OFFICERS AGAIN CHOSEN BY STOCKMEN

ASSOCIATION'S CHOICE UNANIMOUS.

RUSTLING IS TARGET

Vigorous Prosecution Advocated by George Russell—Market Bureau Assistant Chief Urges Increased Beef Production.

Endorsing the policy pursued by the administration of the organization during the past year, the members of the Oregon Cattle and Horse Raisers' association, in the last hour of the afternoon session of their annual convention here yesterday, evinced their approval of the officials of the organization by unanimously re-electing the stockmen chosen last year to handle the affairs of the association. Walter M. Pierce of La Grande started things when he nominated William Pollman of Baker, and in rapid order after Mr. Pollman's election, George Russell of Prineville was chosen vice president, William H. Daughtry of Portland was named second vice president, William Daby of Baker was elected treasurer, and S. O. Correll, from the same city, was picked to succeed himself as secretary.

Rustlers Are Warned. That the ranchers of Central Oregon who are members of the association will pursue a rigid policy of prosecuting cattle rustlers during the coming year was the declaration of Vice President Russell in an address following the election. He stated that there are a number of instances of homesteaders who are selling the meat of stolen stock in the Bend markets, and evinced a willingness to go back to the tactics of the old vigilante days in bringing wrongdoers to justice. "One of the objections that stockmen have to joining the association is that members are not allowed to sit on a jury in a cattle rustling trial," he said. "If they don't let us on a jury, I'm in favor of holding a trial whenever we find the meat of a stolen beef."

Three-Cent Levy Made. Provisions for financing the association during the coming year were taken when a levy of three cents per head on all cattle owned by members was authorized. The action was taken after a statement had been made by Secretary Correll, in which it was shown that the probable expense of the association for the year would total \$9725. The income, on the three-cent levy basis, will amount to \$10,863.

Asks Greater Production. He deplored the fact that increase in production has not kept pace with demand, and expressed the belief that lack of confidence on the part of cattle raisers in the buyers in packing centers is responsible for this, although he emphasized that the livestock commission men are more open and above board than any other class of dealers. Continued investigations and prosecutions of packers, he stated, was another reason why the increase in beef production has been relatively slow. As remedies which the market bureau believes will better conditions along these lines, he favored information, which the department of agriculture has already put into effect by means of its system of telegraphic market reports, better supervision at packing centers and more thorough co-operation between producer and buyer.
