

# A. B. ESTEBENET IS NOT GUILTY

## JURY IN CITY COURT FINDS VERDICT FOR DEFENDANT IN LIQUOR CASE, THEN REFUSES TO ACCEPT FEES FOR WORK.

(From Thursday's Daily.)

Appearing in police court yesterday afternoon, A. B. Estebenet of this city was found not guilty of the charge of having liquor in his possession by a jury composed of Walter C. Salsbery, C. J. Leverett, J. D. Davidson, J. D. Donovan, J. J. Klein and S. H. Stockmon. City Attorney C. S. Benson appeared for the prosecution, E. O. Stadter representing the defendant.

Estebenet was arrested more than two weeks ago, when a satchel containing several bottles of whiskey was found in his store on Bond street. He contended at the time that the bag had been left in his place by some person with whom he was not acquainted, and who said would call for it later. The defendant testified to this while on the stand yesterday, and stated that he had no knowledge of the contents of the satchel. Chief of Police L. A. W. Nixon, who made the arrest, was the only witness for the city.

After turning in their verdict the jurors refused to accept pay for sitting on the case.

# PROSPERITY ON FARMS IS SEEN

## RAILROAD MAN DECLARES PROSPECTS FOR FARMERS ARE BEST IN YEARS—SHORTAGE OF LABOR MAY HINDER HARVEST.

Visiting in Bend on one of his regular official trips to this section, J. T. Hardy, traveling freight and passenger agent for the Oregon Trunk, declared that early season prospects for a record year in agriculture throughout the state are being borne out by present indications.

In a few parts of the state, particularly in Central Oregon, cold weather extending late into the spring has held back vegetation to a certain extent, but not enough to make any marked difference in the ultimate results. A larger acreage under cultivation will be another important factor.

The only disturbing fact mentioned by Mr. Hardy is the shortage of help, which is already becoming apparent. With the present labor demand, the supply is barely adequate, and when the abnormal demand of harvest season comes he fears that some difficulty may be encountered in
