

BEND LOSES BY 12 TO 3 SCORE

MEN OF CORNFOT SHIPYARDS
CHALK UP SEVEN TALLIES BEFORE BRUNN STOPS RIOT IN THIRD INNING.

After working like a machine behind Tetherow Saturday, and defeating the Cornfoot Shipyards nine 3-2, the Bend players, led by their first two pitchers, Slate and Simpson, ascended to the clouds in the third frame and remained aloft while the visitors piled up seven tallies. Another was added in the fourth, one in the eighth, and the final score stood 12-3.

Two of Bend's scores were made in the second, Greenwald making first on Stapleton's out at second, stealing second, advancing to third base when the guardian of that sack fumbled, and scoring on a wild throw to home from third. Bigger went to first when the attempt was made to cut off Greenwald at second, stole second, annexed third on Slate's out to center field, and scored when Ripel, holding third, muffed Shoot's grounder.

In the eighth, Bend's final score was made when Bigger singled, was advanced by Devers' hit, stole, and came home just an instant before Devers was caught in an attempt to steal second.

Third Inning Fatal.

The shipyard men had gone scoreless when Slate's arm went bad in the third. Block found him for a two-bagger, Goddard walked and Williams gained first on Slate's error. McKenna walked, and Block scored. Slate left the mound after pitching himself into a hole against Baird, and Simpson, who was sent in to pitch, solved the difficulty by crippling the batter, scoring Goddard. Another wild one caught Stuerhoff in the back, and Williams trotted home. Brunn relieved Simpson, and induced Bourg to fly out to center, but McKenna rang up another tally by beating out Greenwald's long throw home. Ripel landed on first when Shoots' throw to Houston on third cut off Baird, went to second on Houston's error in fielding Blanchard's near-hit, and ambled in just ahead of Blanchard when Block placed one over the heads of the outfielders. Goddard went out on Shoots' throw to Simpson, transferred to first, and ended the agony.

Three Added in Ninth.

In the fourth, Houston fielded Baird's grounder handily, but whipped a wide one to first, which would not have caught the runner even if Simpson had stopped it. He didn't, and Baird went right on to second, scoring a minute later on Stuerhoff's hit.

Baird started things again in the eighth with a safe one, advancing on Stuerhoff's single, and scoring on Bourg's hit.

In the final inning, Block got to first on Simpson's error, took second when Goddard walked, and went home on Williams' two-sack hit. McKenna's double brought in Goddard and Williams.

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650 QUARTS OF LIQUOR BURNED

FUNERAL SERVICES FOR JOHN BARLEYCORN AT MADRAS PRECEDED BY CREMATION—OWNERS OF CACHE NOT FOUND.

Elaborate funeral services were held in Madras yesterday afternoon when 650 quarts of whiskey, found by Sheriff Ira Holcomb in a field between the county seat and Opal City, were consigned to their final resting place, Bend residents who witnessed the ceremony report today.

In the presence of a large crowd, a deep trench was dug, and the contents of 15 ten-gallon kegs and 50 quart bottles poured in. Lest the liquor might not be of high enough proof, kerosene was added, Sheriff Holcomb applying the match, and cremating John Barleycorn in most approved of style. At the conclusion of the ceremony, the trench was filled with earth.

The liquor disposed of yesterday was found by Sheriff Holcomb after Jefferson county had been given a thorough search following information furnished the Jefferson county authorities by Sheriff Roberts of this county that a quantity of whiskey had probably been cached in that section. The owners of the wet goods have not been found, but one quart out of the entire stock was saved by Mr. Holcomb to be used as evidence in case they are apprehended.

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ZULLIG SENTENCED FOR MANSLAUGHTER

Former Bend Man May Serve Up to 15 Years for Shooting Girl Brought from Switzerland.

Found guilty by a Lake county circuit court jury of shooting his wife more than a year and a half ago at their home at Christmas lake, Robert Zullig, formerly a resident of Bend, has a penitentiary term of from seven and a half to 15 years ahead of him, the sentence passed by Judge L. F. Conn.

Zullig came to Bend a bachelor, and after taking up a homestead in Lake county sent to Switzerland for the girl whom he made his wife and later murdered. They left Bend three years ago.

WHISKEY COSTS POSSESSOR \$250

T. H. JOHNSON, ARRESTED MONDAY MORNING ON LA PINE ROAD, ADMITS GUILT IN JUSTICE COURT AND PAYS FINE.

Although at first vehemently asserting his innocence, T. H. Johnson, arrested early Monday morning, appeared in justice court last night, entered a plea of guilty to the charge of having liquor in his possession and paid the \$250 fine and costs imposed by Judge J. A. Eastes.

Johnson was taken into custody by Sheriff S. E. Roberts and Chief of Police L. A. W. Nixon on the La Pine road eight cases of whiskey being found in the car. At the time Johnson said that the liquor belonged to a companion who had taken the batteries from the machine and made his escape, but later admitted that three cases of the contraband cargo were his own property.

LICE ON TURKEYS.

Four species of lice are commonly found on turkeys in this country. One of these, which occurs particularly on turkeys associated with chickens, is the common body louse of chickens. This species is not to be found in great numbers on the turkeys but it sometimes becomes sufficiently abundant to cause considerable irritation and doubtless is injurious both to the grown fowls and to the young. The shaft louse of chickens also has been found on turkeys, but probably does not breed on that host.

The other two species seem to be native to the turkey, probably existing on this fowl in the wild state. The large turkey louse is probably the most abundant. It occurs on the feathers on various parts of the body, especially on the neck and the breast. The slender turkey louse is a species of good size, though rather elongate, resembling in shape the head louse of chickens. Normally neither of these species is excessively abundant, but on crippled or unthrifty turkeys they may cause serious annoyance and undoubtedly they are injurious to the poultry.

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BOARD FACING ODD SITUATION

THREE OF SCHOOL DIRECTORS GO OUT OF OFFICE IN JUNE, BUT STATE LAW ONLY PERMITS ELECTION OF ONE.

Seeking to straighten out the tangle which confronts the school board if it adheres to the letter of the state law, J. Alton Thompson, clerk of the Bend board of directors, has written to the state superintendent of schools for an opinion as to the proper method of providing for a complete board at the time of the annual school meeting, June 16.

According to the law, the board of a first class district must have a membership of five, and the same authority provides for the election of one member for a three-year term at the coming school meeting. However, there are three directors who will be going out of office, J. P. Keyes, who completes a three-year term, and Carl A. Johnson and R. W. Sawyer, elected in 1917, when the

district passed into the first class division, to serve for two years each.

A possible solution may be that the two-year members may continue to hold office in the time between June 16, 1919, and the school meeting in the succeeding year, when the law allows for the election of more

directors, Mr. Thompson believes.

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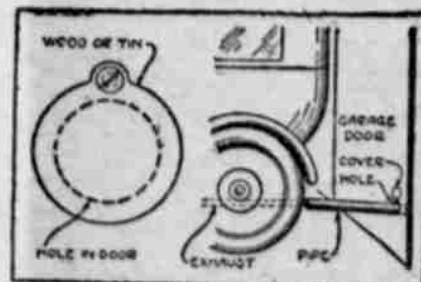

ASPHYXIATION IN A GARAGE

Danger May Be Avoided by Arranging Exhaust of Automobile Through Pipe System.

A simple way to fix a garage so that the motor may be run for any length of time without danger of

asphyxiation to anyone inside may be accomplished as follows:

Cut a hole about 2 1/2 inches in diameter in the door. Over this fit a swinging door, to be closed when not in use. Take a 2-inch pipe, and place one end over the exhaust pipe of the automobile and the other end through the small hole in the door.—S. L. Farwell, in Popular Science Monthly.

TO FIX BROKEN INSULATION

Injury May Be Quickly and Easily Repaired by Using a Small Quantity of Tar.

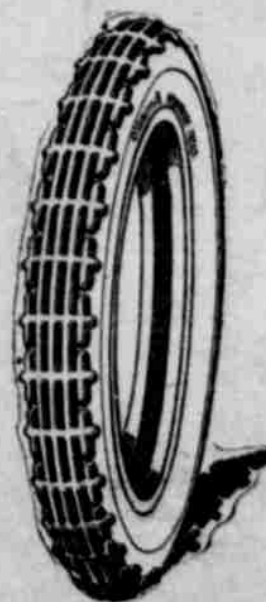
When on the road it is found that wiring insulation is broken with all its attendant troubles, the injured insulation may be quickly and easily repaired by using a small quantity of the tar which is to be found on top of the battery. Melt the tar, and while it is hot spread it over the break in the insulation and cover the whole job with a piece of cloth. Of course, if electrician's tape is at hand this may be used to repair the break; indeed, this is precisely the sort of service for which the tape is intended.
