One report has it that workmen are busy near the Santiam pass. What they are doing is not stated, but their presence has caused a reyival of talk of the possibility of the construction of the Corvallis & Eastern railroad, a line surveyed several years ago from Detroit, on the west side of the Cascades, across the Santiam and over to Tumalo. At that time Bend was not looked upon as holding promise of development, and the survey turned east from Tumalo. If built today the line would undoubtedly come into Bend.


