U S DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

Mixed vegetables are attractive and economical in salads, omelets, escal dishes and to use as garnishes for meat dishes.

All the vegetables are prepared separately as for canning and packed in layers in a well-boiled jar.

Corn and Tomatoes Good
Corn and tomatoes make a good combination to can. The resulting product is served as a vegetable dish.

BAKED ONIONS
Take six good sized onions, or more if desired; remove the centers and chop fine.

TWENTIETH CENTURY CAKE
Cream together 1/2 cup butter and 1 1/2 cups sugar; add 1/2 cup sweet milk, 2 1/2 cups of flour, the well-beaten whites of 4 eggs.

add spices, 1 cup of raisins, seeded and chopped; 1 cup of currants. Bake in two layers; spread the white layers with icing and the dark ones with currant jelly.

ROLLED ROUND STEAK
Fry in butter, one cup of onions cut in small pieces; add one cup bread crumbs, salt and pepper.

MAKE YOUR CANDIED FRUIT
Fruit which is to be candied should be washed, peeled or pared if necessary, and then cut or sliced.

CREAM OF RICE WITH PRUNES
Cook 1/4 cupful of rice in water or milk. Pour in mold. Make a boiled custard with the yolks of 2 eggs.

Fill the onions well with this dressing and place in a covered baking pan, with a few slices of bacon and a little water.
