bers present as at morning session. ORDER APPROPRIATING FUNDS. In the matter of appropriating money from the road fund of the road fund of the county for the construction and maintenance of certain roads in the county.

The petition of Joe Howard, Jr. and other residents of Road District No. 14 was presented at this time, asking for improvements of certain roads as set forth in the petition. After discussion, the petition was granted and the following order entered on record.

Whereas, it is desired by the County Court to appropriate from the regular Road Fund of the County, certain sums for the construction, repair and maintenance of certain roads in Deschutes County, Oregon for the year 1920, and

Whereas, it appears desirable that such appropriation be made at this time and the amount to be expended on each road be set apart for that purpose.

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered that certain sums as hereinafter set forth be, and are hereby appropriated and set apart from the General Road Fund of Deschutes County, Oregon, for the construction, repair or maintenance of certain public roads or highways herein designated within said county, during the year 1920.

The said roads, or highways, and the amount hereby set apart and appropriated for each road are as follows, to-wit:

Arnold District Road (old Bend-Burns Road), commencing at Bend and from there to the Northeast corner of Section Twenty-five (25) in Township Eighteen (18) South, Range Twelve (12) East, Willamette Meridian the sum of Two thousand dollars (\$2000.00) is appropriated and set apart.

Alfalfa-Bend, Road, commencing at Bend and from there to the Southeast corner of Section Twenty-seven (27) in Township Seventeen (17) South, Range Fourteen (14) East, Willamette Meridian, the sum of Two thousand dollars, (\$2000.00) is appropriated and set apart.

Northwest Redmond Road, commencing at the quarter corner between sections Nineteen (19) and Twenty (20), in Township Fourteen (14) South, Range Thirteen (13) East, Willamette Meridian, thence in a southerly direction to Redmond, Two thousand dollars (\$2000.00) is appropriated and set apart.

Terrebonne Road, commencing at the Southwest corner of Section Twenty-two (22) in Township Fourteen (14) South, Range Thirteen (13) East, Willamette Meridian, the sum of Fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) is appropriated and set apart.

The P. J. Young Road (Grange Hall) commencing at the Northeast corner of the Southwest Quarter (SW 1/4) of Northeast Quarter (NE 1/4) of Section Twenty-eight (28) Township Seventeen (17) South, Range Twelve (12) East, Willamette Meridian, and from there to the Northeast corner of Section Nineteen (19) in Township Seventeen (17) South, Range Thirteen (13) East, Willamette Meridian, the sum of Five thousand dollars (\$5000.00) is appropriated and set apart.

Tumalo-Deschutes Road, commencing at the center of Section Thirty-one (31) in Township Sixteen (16) South, Range Twelve East, Willamette Meridian, and from there to the center of Section Twenty-six (26) in Township Sixteen (16) South, Range Twelve (12) East, Willamette Meridian, the sum of Nine hundred dollars (\$900.00) is appropriated and set apart.

The Van Allen Road, commencing at the Southeast corner of the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (NE 1/4 of NE 1/4) of Section Four (4) Township Fifteen (15) South, Range Thirteen (13) East, Willamette Meridian, and from there to the east quarter corner of Section Twenty-five (25) in Township Fourteen (14) South, Range Thirteen (13) East, Willamette Meridian, the sum of Fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) is appropriated and set apart.

The Alfalfa-Crook County line Road, commencing at the Southeast corner of Section Twenty-seven (27) in Township Seventeen (17) South, Range Fourteen (14) East, Willamette Meridian, to a point on the north line of Section Three (3) in Township Seventeen (17) South, Range Fourteen (14) East, Willamette Meridian, the sum of Fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500.00) is appropriated and set apart.

Road Northwest from Deschutes, commencing at the center of Section Twenty-seven (27) in Township Sixteen (16) South, Range Twelve (12) East, Willamette Meridian, and from there to the center of Section Seventeen (17) in Township Sixteen (16) South, Range Twelve (12) East, Willamette Meridian, the sum of Twenty-three hundred dollars, (\$2300.00) is appropriated and set apart.

The Kirk-Whited Road, commencing at the Northeast corner of the Northwest Quarter of Southwest Quarter (NW 1/4 of SE 1/4) of Section Seventeen (17) in Township Fifteen (15) South, Range Thirteen (13) East, Willamette Meridian, and from there to the Southeast corner of Section Thirty-six (36) in Township Fifteen (15) South, Range Twelve East, Willamette Meridian, the sum of One thousand dollars (\$1000.00) is appropriated and set apart.

Co-operative agreement with the Deschutes National Forest Supervisor.

This agreement, made this 4th day of June, 1919, by and between the County Commissioners of Deschutes County and the Forest Supervisor of the Deschutes National Forest.

Witnesseth, that whereas, the Forest Service has expended a considerable sum of money in the survey and construction of roads leading to and from what is known as the Newberry Crater and, whereas, the people of the Lapine section, as well as the Fork Rock section, have generously contributed to the construction of these roads, and, whereas, there is considerable work to be done on what is known as the Pauline Creek Road, which leads from East Lake to Pauline Lake and thence down Pauline Creek; and the

JACK BRULA ROAD. A petition was presented at this time, signed by Jack Brula and others, asking that a road be opened as stated in said petition. The petition being accompanied by sufficient bond, and affidavit of posting road notices, and the form being approved by the District Attorney, petition was approved by the Court.

Ordered, that J. M. Griffin, S. R. Hogin and J. C. Thorp, be appointed as Board of Viewers to view said road, on June 15th.

CITY SEWAGE DISPOSAL PLANT ROAD. Bend, Oregon, May 19, 1919. To the Honorable County Court of Deschutes County, Oregon.

Gentlemen: In the matter of the City Sewage Disposal Plant Road, we the undersigned board of road viewers did on

Lapine road which leads from East Lake to connect with the work already done by the Lapine people on the road leading easterly from Lapine, and, whereas, said work will require a crew of five men and a team for a period of at least 2 1/2 months, beginning July 1, 1919.

Now therefore, the Forest Service, in consideration of the premises to be faithfully performed by the County Commissioners, as hereinafter set forth, hereby agrees to expend at least Eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) for the salaries of five men for approximately 2 1/2 months and also Four hundred dollars (\$400.00) toward the payment of supplies, equipment and team hire and also furnish supervision and survey work.

The County Court of Deschutes County hereby agrees to pay bills in the sum of Two hundred-fifty dollars (\$250.00) to cover expenditure made for supplies or team hire for the above mentioned projects.

In witness whereof, the parties hereunto have affixed their signatures and official seals on the 4th day of June, 1919.

Ordered, a warrant be drawn as per agreement payable to the U. S. Forest Service.

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the 19th day of May, 1919, view out and survey the said road, as outlined in the sworn petition of the City of Bend, which petition prays for the establishment of the same as a twenty-foot road of gateway.

We found a practical route and the said being of service to only two parties, we recommend its establishment as a road or gateway, the same to be twenty feet in width.

We further recommend that along that portion of the road running on the line between the SE 1/4 and SW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 27, Township 17, South, Range 12, East, Willamette Meridian, (the same being between the Jones and Wells ranches) new fences be constructed throughout and such irrigation ditches as are now in the area to be occupied by

the road, be constructed outside the said area.

We further recommend that no damages be allowed any parties on account of the establishment of this road and that the petitioner be required to construct the fences above mentioned and to provide a suitable ditch.
