

MONDELL BILL IS ATTACKED

MEASURE ON WHICH BENHAM FALLS DEVELOPMENT WILL DEPEND TO GET LITTLE REPUBLICAN SUPPORT.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 28.—That the Lane-Mondell soldier land bill will have little support from the republicans in the house was evidenced yesterday when the proposed measure was bitterly attacked in the course of a house debate, after Mondell had made a speech in its favor. Opponents of the bill seemed to carry a majority of Republican sentiment with them.

Particularly sharp criticism was voiced by Scott, of Michigan, and White of Kansas, both republicans. The measure was defended by Sinnott, of Oregon, and Smith, of Idaho, who harassed the opposition with questions. Mondell declared that the question is one that Congress must meet, and that it would be a "terrible indictment" if nothing is done to carry out promises to aid returning soldiers who want lands.

The Lane-Mondell bill is the one which is intended to provide for the construction of the Benham Falls storage reservoir, provided a favorable report is turned in to the U. S. Reclamation service.

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

which are hereto attached and marked "Exhibit B" and "Exhibit C," and whereas, on said 3rd day of June, 1919, no special election had been held in Deschutes County in any one year; and whereas, on said 3rd day of June, 1919 said election was conducted in the same manner as a general election, and the Judges and Clerks appointed for the next proceeding general election did act as Judges and Clerks at such special election; and whereas heretofore at the time and in the manner provided by law the votes cast at said special election have been canvassed in the same manner as a general election; and whereas, the County Court has heretofore found from the election returns and the canvass thereof that a majority of the voters voting at such election did vote in favor of issuing such bonds; and whereas, said County Court finds that every requirement of law relating to the said election has been duly complied with in the form, at the times and in the manner required by law; now, therefore, it is hereby ordered and declared that at the special election held in Deschutes County, Oregon, on the 3rd day of June, 1919, under and pursuant to the provisions of chapter 103, general laws of Oregon, 1913, to determine whether there shall be issued bonds of Deschutes County to the amount of the one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) to mature as follows:

- \$18,000 four (4) years from date of issue;
- \$18,000 five (5) years from date of issue;
- \$18,000 six (6) years from date of issue;
- \$18,000 seven (7) years from date of issue;
- \$18,000 eight (8) years from date of issue;
- \$18,000 nine (9) years from date of issue;
- \$17,000 ten (10) years from date of issue, with interest at not to exceed five and one-half per cent per annum to provide for permanent road construction a majority of the voters voting at such election did vote in favor of issuing such bonds, the vote thereon being as follows:

Yes: 682 votes;
No: 161 votes;

Majority in favor of issuing bonds: 521 votes; and it is further ordered that this order declaring the fact that a majority of the voters voting at such election did vote in favor of issuing such bonds shall be entered in the journal of the County Court and shall be absolutely conclusive as to the regularity of all proceedings in reference to the matter; and it is further hereby ordered and designated that the amount of the total assessed valuation of all the property within the County is \$6,261,328; and the amount of all the previous debts and liabilities of said County insured for road purposes and remaining unpaid is \$ none.
