The plan advocated by members of the Bend Commercial club for the organization of a civic council here, has found a staunch supporter in Miss Elizabeth Tandy, home service secretary for the American Red Cross in the Northwest division, who is spending a few days in Bend on an official visit with the local chapter.

"Community progress today demands the united effort of every group of individuals in the community," Miss Tandy said when interviewed Thursday afternoon. "Many communities in the United States have organized Community Councils which act as clearing houses and social planning boards for activities in any way concerned with public welfare. Duplication of effort is avoided. Long time programs of community betterment are worked out through the concentrated effort of every group.

"The value of a Community Council has been proved beyond all doubt during the past ten years in the rural districts of Massachusetts. Roads, sanitation, care of the poor and agricultural methods have been

SNOW HERE AS DEEP AS IN EARLY STORM

Central Oregon Spared Intense Cold and High Winds of Winter of 1884-85, Says Pioneer

Snow in and near Bend is just as deep as during the historic winter of 1884-85, but Central Oregon has been spared the intense cold and high winds which accompanied the blizzard which brought disaster to the pioneer stockmen of this part of the state, was the declaration today of C. D. Allen, one of the earliest residents of what is now Deschutes county.

Mr. Allen had a band of 3,500 sheep at Pringle Flats and in six days time was able to make only seven miles. At the end of the trip, 1000 of the original band had died of exposure and hunger. Hundreds of cattle and horses died from lack of food, he said, and ranchers attempting to save their stock, had to penetrate deep drifts piled up by the high wind.

While the storm was on, the mercury hovered between 25 and 30 below zero, but it was almost impossible to tell just how what degree of cold actually was reached, as many of the thermometers were frozen.
