

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

Be it remembered, That a regular term of the County Court of Deschutes county, in the State of Oregon, was begun and held at the Court house in Bend, in said County on Wednesday, the 3rd day of September, 1919, said day being the day fixed by law for the holding of a term of the County Court in said County, when were present:

Hon. W. D. Barnes, County Judge; C. H. Miller, County Commissioner; Seth Stookey, County Commissioner; J. H. Haner, County Clerk; S. E. Roberts, Sheriff.

Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit: In the matter of the petition of Carl Larson and others for a County road.

At this time is presented to the court, a petition signed by Carl Larson, and others, for the establishing of a county road in the Alfalfa road district, and at the same time is presented a remonstrance against the granting of the prayer of said petitioners, and it now appearing to the court that the legality of both the petition and the remonstrance is in question, it was:

Ordered: That said matter be referred to the district attorney for his opinion upon the legality of said petition and remonstrance, and that a further hearing be continued to September 17, 1919.

Thursday, September 4, 1919, second day.

In the matter of claims:

This matter comes on at this time upon the auditing of claims presented for payment, when after due consideration it was ordered:

That the following numbered claims entered in the claim docket and numbered as follows, to-wit:

Claims No. 2916 to No. 2931, inc. Claims No. 2933 to No. 2945, inc. Claims No. 2948 to No. 2951, inc. Claims No. 2957 to No. 2984, inc. Claims No. 2988 to No. 2999, inc. Claims No. 4002 to No. 4005, inc. Claims No. 4007 and 4009. Claims No. 4011 to No. 4027, inc.

Be and the same are hereby approved and allowed, and the county clerk is instructed to issue warrants in payment thereof.

Further ordered, that claim No. 2932 be allowed at \$79.35.

Further ordered, that claim No. 2946 be allowed at \$7.60.

Further ordered, that claims No. 2952, 2896, 4000 and 4001 be and the same are hereby disallowed.

Further ordered, that claims No. 2895, 2897, 4006 and 4008 be continued for further investigation.

Court then adjourned to September 17, 1919.

Court reconvened September 17, 1919 at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon all members being present.

In the matter of the petition of Carl Larson and others for a county road.

At this time this matter comes on to be heard pursuant to the order of the court heretofore entered in the matter, and it now appearing to the court, after hearing the arguments of the attorneys for the petitioners, for the objectors, and E. O. Stadter, appearing specially for the district attorney, that there are 17 qualified signers on said petition, and 12 qualified signers on the remonstrance;

That the petition is a valid legal petition signed by not less than 12 freeholders residing in the district in which the proposed road is to be established, and that there is no valid remonstrance thereto, it is therefore:

Ordered: That the said petition be and the same is hereby allowed.

Further ordered, That the remonstrance filed herein against the establishing of said road be and the same is hereby dismissed and disallowed.

Further ordered: That Robert Gould, County Surveyor, and A. S. Holmes, and R. J. Skelton be and they are hereby appointed viewers on said road and matter, and that they meet at the point of beginning of said road as stated in said petition, on September 20, 1919 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon of said day, or within ten days thereafter, and not otherwise except by order of the court to view, survey if necessary and lay out said road, and that said board of viewers file their report of their proceedings in this court on or before Wednesday, October 1, 1919.

In the matter of the Lower Bridge Terrebonne road.

At this time is presented to the court a communication from residents of Lower Bridge road district No. 14, as follows, to-wit:

To the County Court,

Deschutes County Oregon,

Whereas there was a meeting held of the citizens and freeholders of Lower Bridge on September 12th. We were appointed a committee to present the matter of the Lower

Bridge-Terrebonne road to this court.

Our instructions from that meeting were to request the court to use as much of the present road fund as is feasible taking it from Lower Bridge by way of the McCauley corner south to the intersection of the Redmond-Terrebonne road.

We are also instructed to call to the courts attention that there is a good grade of gravel at Tetherow Bridge for use on the road if the Court sees it feasible.

Young road, which have been designated by the farm bureau as roads to be improved from direct taxes during the year 1920, said investigation to be commenced September 24, 1919.

OCTOBER TERM 1919.

Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

In the matter of the improvement of the Deschutes-Tumalo road.

This matter comes on to be heard upon the proposal of the Central Oregon Irrigation Company, through C. M. Redfield and F. S. Stanley, as officers of said Company, to improve the road from Deschutes to Tumalo in accordance with the program adopted by the committee of the farm bureau, whereby said Company agrees to furnish all tools and equipment, and to furnish a foreman for the work, and such improvement appearing to the court to be necessary, it was:

Ordered: That the said Central Oregon Irrigation Company be and it is hereby authorized to improve the said road from Deschutes to Tumalo at a cost of not to exceed \$900.00, exclusive of tools and supervision, and that the cost of said tools and supervision be assumed by the Company.

In the matter of certificates for delinquent taxes in Hillman.

Upon the petition of Mrs. H. S. Kentner, it was ordered that the sheriff be and here is hereby instructed to issue a delinquent tax certificate to Mrs. H. E. Kentner for lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 Block 35, in Hillman, upon the payment by her of all taxes now due, with penalties and interest charged against said property.

In the matter of the petition of Carl Larson, et al, for a County road.

This matter now comes on for hearing upon the report of the Board of Viewers appointed herein, which report was read for the first time.

In the matter of certificates of delinquency for unpaid taxes.

This matter comes on at this time upon the petition of J. M. Fuller for a certificate of delinquency upon lot 9, Block 68, in Redmond, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the court that there are unpaid delinquent taxes upon said property, it is:

Ordered: That the Sheriff be, and he hereby is instructed to issue to J. M. Fuller a delinquent certificate for taxes due upon lot 9, block 68, in Redmond, upon the payment of all taxes, penalties, and interest due thereon.

In the matter of an appropriation for the Reveille Fair Week.

At this time R. A. Ward and J. A. Thompson came before the court asking for an appropriation for the expenses of the fair to be held during Reveille week.

Ordered that \$165.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the County Fair fund for such purpose.

In the matter of bills against the county.

Ordered that notice of call for bids be published in the official paper for the construction of the grade on the west side of the Deschutes river on the C. B. Swalley road, and for separate bids for the material and construction of a bridge across the Deschutes river on said C. B. Swalley road, and for the fill between the two sections of the bridge, the same being one of the roads designated for improvement by the committee of the farm bureau.

The court then adjourned for the term.
