LABOR FRIEND OF EDUCATION

TIMBERWORKERS UNANIMOUSLY ENDORSE MILLAGE BILL FOR STATE SCHOOLS — TO URGE REGISTRATION.

Believing that a large proportion of the young men and women who apply for entrance at the University of Oregon, the Oregon Agricultural College, and the Monmouth Normal, are the sons and daughters of working people, the Bend local of the Timberworkers union, in its regular meeting last Thursday, voted unanimously to endorse the higher education millage bill which will come before the people of Oregon at the May primaries. Not only is this legislation endorsed, but the union will conduct a systematic campaign for 100 per cent registration, in order that the men and women who are backing the cause of higher education may support their opinions with their votes on May 21.

"The action taken last night is in keeping with the general policy of the union and of the Federation of Labor," Secretary Call stated in commenting on the stand taken by the local. "There was absolutely no discussion that was not entirely favorable on this question."
