CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY SHOWN

Commencement Address Delivered by Dr. James H. Gilbert Points to Education to Combat Enemies of Democracy.

Dr. James H. Gilbert, of the desartment of economics of the University of Oregon, delivered the graduating address. Speaking on the subject, "Education and Civic Responsibility," he declared that education is the greatest safeguard of American democracy, and warned against what he considers the two greatest dangers confronting that democracy -propenses to act on impulse, and the tendency to place selfish class and sectional interests above those of the state and nation.
