

B. W. L. & P. ADDS RESERVE PLANT

PUMPING WITHIN CITY ELIMINATED

Thoroughly Aerated Water Taken at
Foot of Rapids, Passes Through
Gravel and Is Chlorinated
As Added Precaution.

An emergency plant which can not only furnish twice as much water as Bend can possibly use, but which also eliminates the necessity for pumping from the river within the city limits, constitutes the new equipment which the Bend Water, Light & Power company, at a cost of more than \$15,000, has placed at the disposal of the city which it serves. By nature's methods, the water which passes through the plant is purified, for the pumping station is situated at the foot of the rapids, where a thorough aeration takes place. The city of Los Angeles, says T. H. Foley, manager of the local power company, has spent \$200,000 to create, artificially, conditions which insure aeration of like degree.

Not depending alone on nature's methods, however, further purification is provided in the installation of a chlorination plant, where a pound and a half of chlorine gas is fed every 24 hours into the 14-inch main supplying the city. The quantity used has been determined only after considerable experiment, the amount of gas introduced into the main being so small as to leave no taste or odor, but sufficient to kill practically all micro-organisms.

Purity Is Insured.
Before the water in the emergency system reaches the chlorination plant, it is passed through a 30,000-gallon covered concrete reservoir, or settling basin. This reservoir is divided by a gravel screen, through which all water is forced before entering the main.

Chlorination plant, reservoir and pumping plant have all been constructed within the last few months, and are in addition to the gravity system by which the city derives its normal supply from the C. O. I. canal.

Power for the pumps is provided by a high-tension line, carrying 2300 volts, from the steam plant at the Brooks-Scanlon mill, to a point at the foot of the rapids, about two and a half miles south of the city. Two pumps are maintained, although one is amply sufficient to supply the city's needs. The building sheltering the pumping machinery is of the cold storage type of construction, which will effectually prevent any impairment of efficiency because of cold.

From the plant the aerated water is raised through a 10-inch pipe at the rate of 750 gallons per minute to the settling reservoir.

WAGON TRIP MADE ACROSS MOUNTAINS

Making the first part of his round trip to Newberg by wagon, from Fort Rock, J. B. Gaudin arrived in Bend on Monday by train and will leave for his home by auto tomorrow morning. Mr. Gaudin accompanied J. Wilbur Gubser, Fort Rock merchant, when the latter moved a part of his stock of goods and other belongings to Newberg a week ago, journeying by way of the McKenzie pass, and making their way over roads which would probably have been impassable to a motor-driven vehicle.

Mr. Gubser remained in Newberg, while Mr. Gaudin is returning to Central Oregon to make his home.

OFFICERS GET JAILBREAKER

CLUE TO WHEREABOUTS OF
JACK McCULLOUGH OBTAINED
THROUGH ANXIETY TO RE-
CEIVE LETTER FROM GIRL.

On a warrant from the sheriff at Prosser, Wash., Jack McCullough, who broke jail at that city in February, was arrested Thursday on Tumalo creek, two and a half miles above the fish hatchery, by Deputies Tom Carlson, Lee Stevens and H. McDonald. McCullough is said to have formerly been an inmate at the Washington penitentiary, but the charge on which he was imprisoned there or at Prosser is not known to the officials here. He refused to talk when Deputy McDonald surprised him, but denied that he was the man wanted.

The officers were guided to the camp on the Tumalo by Joe Markee of this city, with whom McCullough had been fishing for the past three days. Markee came into touch with the authorities this morning when he called at the postoffice for McCullough's mail. As he left the building, Deputies Stevens and Carlson drew their guns, believing that Markee was their man. He quickly proved his identity and offered his services. He had had no knowledge of McCullough's record.

The prisoner had been expecting a letter from a girl in Zella, Wash. Mr. Carlson stated, and it was his anxiety on this point which led to his apprehension. A piece of a hack saw was found in McCullough's pocket.

McCullough was brought into Bend shortly after 3 o'clock on Thursday and a wire was immediately sent to Prosser notifying the authorities there of his capture and asking that an officer be sent for him. McCullough is said to have come to Central Oregon several weeks ago with Perry Watterman, who was apprehended through the efforts of Sheriff Roberts and returned to Prosser.

MOONSHINE FOUND IN DESERTED CAR

Five Gallons of Raison Liquor In
Auto Left Parked on Frank-
lin Avenue.

Loaded with five gallons of moonshine, a car listed as belonging to John Weber of this county was found parked on Franklin street, near the Presbyterian church, Saturday night by Chief of Police Nixon. Two men, apparently slightly intoxicated, who had been riding in the machine while it was being followed, had vanished, and neither has appeared to claim either car or moonshine.

The liquor, Chief Nixon states, seems to have been made from raisins and is not high proof.

CHECK PASSER IS FREED BY COURT

At the close of a somewhat protracted hearing in justice court last Thursday, C. E. Stead, formerly of La Grande, charged with passing a worthless check, issued to the Owl Pharmacy, was released by the court, the complaining witness declining to continue prosecution after the loss had been made good. Stead announced his intention of securing work in Bend and making good the \$20 advanced by the Central Labor council to cover his check, and also liquidating his \$30 hotel bill.
