

NEW BOARD TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CEMETERY

ORDINANCE PROVIDES FOR CHANGE

STREET WORK ASKED

Graveling Needed in Newport Avenue District, Councilman Declares—Removal of Fire Hazard is Sought By Administration.

Formation of a cemetery association, to have charge of the management of the Bend cemetery, is provided for in an ordinance which was read for the first time at Friday's meeting of the city council. The ordinance, which represents ideas advanced by members of the Women's Civic Improvement league, as well as by the city administration, provides for cemetery administration on much the same general plan as that outlined for the handling of city park affairs, and makes the chairman of the public property committee of the council a member of the board which will have control of cemetery management. The other members are: Mrs. Ralph Spencer, C. P. Niswonger, Mrs. Frank Toomey, Mrs. A. F. Larson and E. P. Brosterhouse. After the passage of the ordinance, which is regarded by the city administration as virtually assured, one of the improvements to be attempted by the new management will be in the matter of bringing water to the cemetery tract for irrigation purposes.

Graveling Advised. Chairman Rhodes of the streets committee reported the placing of highway signs at the chief intersections in the city for the benefit of tourists. He mentioned the question of the wage scale paid for labor on the Greenwood avenue bridge over the canal, brought up at the last meeting, reporting that the structure had been completed shortly after the matter was placed before the council, and that there was, consequently, no investigation to be made.

Mr. Rhodes asked that the council consider the advisability of using a thin layer of gravel as a protective covering for the cinder road improvements just completed in the Newport avenue district. The ques-

tion of costs on such an improvement was referred to the streets committee, as well as replanking the Newport avenue bridge and hard surfacing part of the east approach, which was advised in the informal report of the chairman.

Fire Menace Seen. That the greatest fire menace which the city now has is the Aune barn on Bond street was the declaration made by Councilman Payne, in the course of discussion of the recent fire farther north on the same street. A fire at the feed barn, Chief Carlton said, would mean the destruction of approximately three blocks in the center of the business district. The police and fire committee was instructed to take up with the owners the matter of the removal of the building.

Chief Carlton suggested the formation of a firemen's patrol, the installation of a standpipe on the Newport avenue bridge and the leveling of trees within the fire district. He was instructed to proceed with the organization of a patrol, the other matters being referred for further consideration.

New Equipment Needed. Councilman McPherson presented a list of bills for medical attention, replacing of damaged clothes and loss of time in connection with the fire, the total coming to \$60. They were ordered paid without question and the recorder was instructed to write the fire department, expressing the approval of the council in regard to the department's work during the conflagration.

A list of new equipment, which Fire Chief Carlton declared was needed, was presented and the council ordered the purchase of two smoke helmets and a four-way valve, leaving the other items, which include 2000 feet of hose, for future consideration.

Representing the library board, George Paddock appeared before the council to ask for a portion of the \$3000 appropriation appearing on the city budget. A warrant for \$1386 was ordered drawn.

RAIN SAFEGUARDS TIMBERED AREAS

Rain, which fell earlier in the week, will make the higher timbered stretches of the Cascades safe from fire during the remainder of the summer, according to Supervisor N. G. Jacobson of the Deschutes National forest. As to the lower timbered areas, the protection thus afforded will be only a matter of days.

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T. B. CLINIC IS PLANNED HERE

ALL RESIDENTS OF DESCHUTES, JEFFERSON AND CROOK COUNTIES ELIGIBLE FOR EXAMINATION ON AUGUST 6.

Under the auspices of the Central Oregon Medical association, a tuberculosis clinic will be held in Bend Friday, August 6, Miss Margaret Brems, Red Cross nurse, announced today. The exact location has not yet been selected, but 10 to 12 o'clock in the morning, 2 to 5 o'clock in the afternoon, and 7 to 9 o'clock in the evening have been set as the hours.

Any resident of Deschutes, Jefferson or Crook counties who has any of the symptoms of tuberculosis, or who has any reason to believe that he is suffering from the disease, is urged to be present for examination. Among the more common symptoms mentioned by Miss Brems are a continued feeling of fatigue, loss of weight and a persistent cough.

A tuberculosis specialist will be in Bend during the clinic to oversee the examinations.

COLD STORAGE PLAN FOR MEATS IS USED

Expensive System Installed by Proprietor of Beaver Market to Insure Quality of Food Supply.

To insure the perfect keeping of meats during the warm summer months, W. A. Beaver, proprietor of the Beaver market on Bond and the Cash market on Oregon street, has just completed the installation of a \$1250 cold storage plant in the former shop, and, while the same results are attained by the use of ice in the latter establishment, he plans to use ammonia evaporation for cooling in the Cash market in the near future. By renting space at the ice factory, he is able to hold meats for from two to three weeks before placing them on sale, he states.

In his Bond street market, the refrigerating plant put in by Ray Fairchild of Portland, which produces cold sufficient to manufacture a ton and a half of ice daily, keeps two rooms of a total capacity of 960 cubic feet constantly below freezing point and makes winter in the glass counter, in which meats are kept for immediate use.

COBB FILM STARTS LATE NEXT MONTH

Adventures of Humorous Writer in Quest For Quiet To Be Staged In Central Oregon.

"Cobb's Quest for Quiet," a moving picture film, in which it is planned by the promoters, A. Whisnant, and N. G. Jacobson of Bend, to blend the scenic features of Central Oregon with the convention-tired features of the famous humorist and magazine writer, will be started in The Dalles on August 27, on the arrival of Irvin S. Cobb in that city, it was learned here today.

From The Dalles, Mr. Cobb will plod wearily southward pursued by a retinue of camera men, reaching his goal in the lakes and wood mountains near Bend. What company will be offered the privilege of filming the series of episodes has not been announced.

SMALL FOREST FIRE IS UNDER CONTROL

A small fire in the timber near Lava Lake was reported to be burning briskly on Monday, but employees of the Deschutes National Forest were on the ground shortly after the blaze started, and by this afternoon the flames were well under control. Deputy Supervisor W. O. Harriman stated. The cause of the fire is not known.
