W. D. Barnes, County Judge; C. H. Miller, County Commissioner; Seth Stookey, County Clerk; S. E. Roberts, Sheriff.
Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:
IN THE MATTER OF SALARIES OF COUNTY OFFICERS AND DEPUTIES:
This matter now comes on to be heard and, it appearing to the Court that the salary of the following officers is fixed by law, to-wit: Sheriff, County Judge, Superintendent of Schools, Assessor, Treasurer, County Clerk.
Ordered, That the Clerk be, and he hereby is, directed to issue his warrants monthly in payment of said salaries in accordance with the law applicable thereto.
Ordered, That the salary of August A. Anderson be, and the same is hereby, fixed at \$150.00 per month, and the Clerk is instructed to issue his warrant in payment thereof in the same manner and at the times of issuing salary warrants.
Ordered, That the salary of Hazel Manion be, and the same is hereby, fixed at \$115.00 per month for services in the Tax Collector's office, and the Clerk is directed to issue his warrant in payment thereof in the time and manner provided for salary payments.
Ordered, That the Clerk issue his warrants in payment of the following sums for the care of county indigents, to-wit:

Ordered further, That the Clerk issue his warrant in the sum of \$170.00 per month to Deschutes Investment Company for rent of the court house and jail.
IN THE MATTER OF THE LOWER BRIDGE COUNTY ROAD:
At this time is presented a petition by the freeholders of Lower Bridge road district, as follows, to-wit:
Petition.
To the Honorable County Court of Deschutes County:
We, the undersigned, freeholders of Deschutes County, Oregon, and residents of road district No. 14, otherwise known as Lower Bridge road district, do most humbly petition your honorable board that, whereas there has been a sum of \$5000.00 allowed out of the bond issue voted by the people at the recent election in Deschutes County, otherwise known as the \$125,000.00 issue for road purposes.
Now, therefore, we ask your honorable board to call for bids for construction of what is known as the Lower Bridge-Terrebonne road, for which the above sum of \$5000.00 has been allowed.
We suggest that your honorable board direct County Road Master Mr. May to locate said road and recommend that said road follow the present route as practical, and that no large or unnecessary amount be expended gravelling said road in order that the surfacing of said road by gravel or cinders be completed, if possible, out of the above mentioned sum of \$5000.00.

Be it remembered, That at a regular term of the County Court of Deschutes County, Oregon, begun and held at the County court house in Bend, in Deschutes County, Oregon, on the 7th day of January, 1920, for the transaction of county business, and from day to day thereafter during the continuance of said term, there being present: Hon. W. D. Barnes, County Judge, presiding; Hon. C. H. Miller, County Commissioner; Hon. Seth Stookey, County Commissioner; S. E. Roberts, Sheriff; J. H. Haner, County Clerk. The following, among other proceedings, were had, to-wit:
Whereas, At a regular term of the County Court of Deschutes County, Oregon, begun and held at the County court house in Bend, in said County and state, on the 5th day of November, 1919, that being a regular day provided by law for the sitting of said County Court for the transaction of county business, the said Court by resolution then and there made declared its intention to establish and locate a road in Deschutes County between the city of Bend and the south line of Jefferson County, Oregon, the same to be a part of what is known as "The Dalles-California Highway," and more particularly described as follows:
Commencing at a point on the line between Deschutes and Jefferson Counties approximately 1990 feet east of the NE corner of Section 4, Township 14 North of Range 13 East, W. M., thence running in a general southerly direction through and across Sections 3, 4, 16, 21, 28, 33 and 34, in Township 14, South of Range 13 East, W. M., to a point on the line marking the north corporate limits of the city of Redmond, 86.5 feet west of the southeast corner of the NE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of said Section 9, in Township 15, South of Range 13 E., W. M., and commencing on the line which marks the south corporate limits of the said city of Redmond at a point 50 feet west from the north quarter corner of Section 21, Township 15, South of Range 13 East, W. M., and running through and across Sections 31, 20, 29 and 30, in Township 15, South of Range 13 East, W. M., and the SE 1/4 of Sec. 36, Township 15, South of Range 12 East, W. M., and Sections 1, 11, 14, 15, 16, 28, 33 and 32, in Township 16, South, Range 12 East, W. M., and Sections 5, 8, 17, 20, 28 and 29 in Township 17 South, Range 12 East, W. M., to the line which marks the north corporate limits of the city of Bend, in Deschutes County, at a point approximately 390 feet west of the SE 1/4 corner of the NE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 29, in Township 17 South, Range 12 East, W. M., said road to be 60 feet wide throughout its entire length and to follow, and correspond substantially to the survey of the said "The Dalles-California Highway," as now surveyed, staked and marked out between the point above mentioned, by the engineers employed by the State Highway Commission.
And whereas, The said resolution of this Court was enacted, ordered and put into effect on the said 5th day of November, 1919, and the minutes thereof spread upon its records, and
Whereas, The said minutes of said Court and the said resolution have not heretofore been reduced to writing by the Court, in order to preserve a permanent record of same; now, therefore, it is hereby ordered by this Court as follows:
It is hereby ordered, That the foregoing resolution and minutes of this court, made and entered on the said 5th day of November, 1919, and upon which notices of the Court's intention to establish said road by resolution have been duly posted according to law, is hereby declared to be the resolution and minutes of this Court as made on the said 5th day of November, 1919, and this order is hereby entered nunc pro tunc as of the said 5th day of November, 1919.

This matter comes on at this time for further consideration, and the Court, not being fully advised in the premises, the matter was continued for further hearing until Wednesday, March 24th, 1920, at 2 o'clock p. m.
The Court then adjourned to meet March 24th, 1920, at 2 o'clock p. m.
Court reconvened March 24th, 1920, at 2 o'clock p. m., pursuant to adjournment, all members being present.
IN THE MATTER OF THE DALLES-CALIFORNIA HIGHWAY:
This matter now comes on for hearing and the Court not now being sufficiently advised, continues the matter for final hearing until Friday, March 26th, 1920, at 2 o'clock p. m.
IN THE MATTER OF THE TETHEROW BRIDGE:
This matter comes on to be heard upon the oral complaint that said bridge is unsafe, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that an order should be made condemning said bridge, it is therefore
Ordered, That the said Tetherow bridge over the Deschutes river in Section 16, Tp. 14, Range 12, be, and the same is hereby, condemned for any load exceeding three tons gross weight.
The Court was then adjourned to meet March 26th, 1920, at 2 o'clock p. m.
Court reconvened March 26th, 1920, at 2 o'clock p. m., pursuant to adjournment, all members being present.
IN THE MATTER OF THE SALARY OF THE JANITOR:
