or systems in the event of the failure to pay such costs and expenses. 3. The said Terrebonne Mutual Telephone association, its successors or assigns, shall have the right, privilege and authority to change, move or transfer its system or systems of poles, wires, or other apparatus to such portion of the new "The Dalles-California Highway," as at such time as the said highway may be constructed; Provided, however, that any such system or systems of poles, wires or other apparatus of the Terrebonne Mutual Telephone association, its successors or assigns, that may be changed, moved or transferred from any existing public roads or highways, to "The Dalles-California Highway" shall be so constructed on the opposite side of the road from any then existing system or systems of telephone wire that may then be constructed or maintained along said proposed "The Dalles-California Highway."

This franchise or order shall be in full force and effect from the 4th day of June, 1920.
