JULY TERM, 1920 Be it remembered, That a regular term of the county court of Deschutes county, in the state of Oregon, was begun and held at the courthouse in Bend, in said county, on Wednesday, the 7th day of July, 1920, said day being the day fixed by law for the holding of a term of the county court in said county, when were present Hon. Whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit: In the matter of damages for The Dalles-California highway: Ordered, That the clerk issue a warrant, payable to M. C. Metcalf, for \$100 as additional compensation for damages for land taken for The Dalles-California highway, said payments, with \$200 heretofore ordered paid, to be in full compensation for all damages incurred by said M. C. Metcalf.

In the matter of the petition of W. C. Hollinshead for county road: Now is presented the viewers' report heretofore filed in said matter and, it appearing to the court that said report is favorable, and said road a public necessity, the report was read publicly for the first time, according to law.

In the matter of claims: Ordered, That claims No. 1 to No. 52, as the same are entered at pages 200 and 201, and heretofore, on July 1st, 1920, approved for payment by the County Judge under direction of the court, be, and the same are hereby, approved and allowed; and, further, that the payment thereof under order of the judge be, and the same is hereby, approved.

County court was reconvened July 14th, 1920, all members being present. In the matter of market road funds: Ordered by the court, That when the state treasurer, or the secretary of state, shall remit funds for the market road fund, the county clerk and the county treasurer shall credit such funds to the general road fund.

In the matter of adjustments of county road funds: And now, on this 14th day of July, 1920, comes on this matter to be heard upon the application of the county clerk and the county treasurer for the sum of \$3437.50 as interest on outstanding road improvement bonds, and that there is now in the general county funds certain moneys received from the collection of taxes levied for the purpose of paying such interest, and which has not been used therefor, it is Ordered by the court, That the county clerk and the county treasurer be, and they hereby are, instructed to transfer the sum of \$3437.50 from the general fund to the general road fund.
