

Car Overtakes, Boy Speeder Is Badly Injured

Fourteen year old Fred Stauffer was critically injured near Redd yesterday afternoon when the light "bug" in which he was speeding, left the road and turned over before it re-turned to earth 30 feet farther on. Young Stauffer was pinned under the wreck. Four ribs were fractured, one being completely detached from his spine, while one of his lungs was penetrated by a sliver of bone from another broken rib. The boy is being cared for at St. Charles hospital, where his condition is admitted to be serious.

An older brother, Roy, was in the car at the time of the accident, but was unhurt.

NIGHT SCHOOL SHOWS A HEALTHY INCREASE

Enrollment Grows, And Earnest Purpose Is Evidenced By Students In Evening Classes.

Registration at night school is showing a healthy growth and, while a number of part time students are in attendance in compliance with the school law, the majority of those enrolled are well past the school age and, in taking the work, are recognizing the opportunity for acquiring additional educational advantages.

excusable. He pointed to the \$50,000,000 investment for spruce logging railroads, and then mentioned that only 8 per cent of the spruce used for airplanes was obtained through government operations. He scored the cost plus system of letting government war contracts, and concluded his arraignment of the administration with the statement that the voters of America, holding an inquest over the democratic party, will return a verdict of "death from natural causes, due to inefficiency in caring for the nation's needs."

Senator Harding's sympathy with the needs of the West was particularly emphasized, the speaker pointing out that in the republican nominee the cause of reclamation has an ardent champion. "In addition, Senator Harding is solid, safe and sound, ever ready to take council," he said. "If he is elected, the voters of Oregon will never have cause to regret it."

Urges Tariff Change.
Touching on the issue of the tariff, Senator McNary showed that the country's need for protection has never been greater than now. The heartiest applause of the evening greeted his declaration that "we need a protective tariff, and we will have it." And he added: "It is more necessary now than ever before, if we are to keep the United States from becoming the dumping ground of the manufactures of Europe."

"The merchant marine bill," he said, "is a question of using the vessels we have to the utmost advantage. President Wilson has refused to function under this bill. If you do not keep the merchant marine, you will lose your club to use in forcing down the high rail transportation rates which are now threatening to bring suffering to this community."

Would Not Cancel Debts.
On the League of Nations question McNary recorded a plea for the preservation of American national integrity. "I do not want Americans to police foreign countries, and I do not believe that we should remit the debts of our associates in the war," he said. "But I do believe that the peace treaty and the league are capable of being remedied by reservations. The republican candidate for president is against the league covenant as it stands today, but he is anxious that some more fitting instrument may be found to guarantee the peace of the world."

Senator McNary left this morning for Redmond, where he was to be the guest of the Commercial club at dinner this noon. In the afternoon he planned to go over the irrigated and irrigable lands tributary to Redmond. Tomorrow he is scheduled to speak at Prineville.
