

SECESSION OF NORTHERN LAKE COUNTY ASKED

FEELING IS GENERAL SAYS PAPER

MAY BE NEW COUNTY

Annexation To Deschutes County Suggested In Communication Which Silver Lake Leader Declares Representative.

That residents of northern Lake county are seriously considering secession from Lake and annexation by Deschutes, is strongly indicated in the last issue of the Silver Lake Leader. The suggestion is made in the form of a communication to the Leader, by J. Naldrett of Summer Lake, and editorial comment in the same issue declares that Naldrett "strikes straight out from the shoulder, and what he has the courage to say in print has been publicly expressed in this part of the county for some time."

Criticism, of the Lake county government, as far as Naldrett's letter is concerned, is apparently based on the road situation—faulty repair, and unjust location.

Would Annex

His point regarding annexation to Deschutes county is made when he says: "You north Lake county people with your sand drifted, water washed, rocky, unworked roads, with culverts and bridges of poles, is it not time you awaken from your Rip Van Winkle slumbers? Is it not time to call a special election and either divide our county and establish a county seat at Silver Lake; with officers that will see, at least, that a part of the rocks are removed? If not a separate county let us then be annexed to Deschutes county. It sure can't be any worse."

WILL RESUME WAR ON HOPPERS SOON

War against the grasshoppers of Crane Prairie will be resumed early in September, County Agriculturist D. L. Jamison states. At present water is so high at the prairie that the insects have for the most part retreated to the Cultus lake side, now rather inaccessible to mankind.

The egg-laying season is due to start soon, the county agent says, and he is particularly anxious to be able to start operations against the hoppers just before that time.

MOWER CLIPS OFF LEGS OF POLECAT

While cutting alfalfa last Thursday afternoon, the mower operated by Melvin Crow on his ranch 18 miles east of Bend, encountered a skunk. Two of the animal's legs were cut off before the machine could be stopped, and the supply of perfume furnished for the occasion by the polecat was sufficient to ruin three tons of hay, it was estimated.

INDUSTRIAL BUYING OF LUMBER BEST OF ENTIRE YEAR, NOTED

"While demand from the small retail lumber dealer continues to be the backbone of the market, nevertheless it is plainly evident to close observers that the proportion of the sales now going to industrial concerns is larger than at any other time this year," says the American Lumberman. "Railroad orders, although not of exceptional size, are very encouraging to lumber manufacturers.

"As most of them are for special cutting, the demand has been sufficient to stimulate prices. In the South and to some extent on the Pacific coast. Buying at the Coast has been quieter than buying in southern pine territory, so Coast prices have not been affected so much by the betterment in demand. As purchasers continue to ask for quick shipment, it is evident that the bulk

of the orders now being placed is not for speculative purposes but to fill immediate requirements.

"It is generally conceded that the prices of common grades of lumber are very low—so low in fact that a good demand would make an advance certain. For upper grades the demand has been good all year, consequently supplies of them are short and their prices are firmer. Orders booked so far this year call for a slightly greater amount of lumber than has been produced.

"The following report of production, shipments and orders, for the period January 3 to August 13, inclusive, has been compiled by the National Lumber Manufacturers' association:

CONFLICT GONE IN GAME LAWS

STATE AND FEDERAL OPENING DATES FOR DUCK SEASON NOW COINCIDE—HUNTING STARTS SEPTEMBER 16.

Hunters starting the duck and goose season this year need have no fear of conflict between state and federal laws, for the statute was changed at the last session of the legislature so that the dates for the opening of the Oregon and national season, coincide. According to the new statute, ducks may be hunted from September 16 to December 31, both days inclusive. The law in effect last year caused much confusion among sportsmen, as it provided for an opening date of October 1, the federal opening, of course, being the same as now.

The bag limit on ducks is 25 birds in a day, but not to exceed 30 in seven consecutive days. The seven day limit for geese is the same, but the single day limit is eight.

The deer season in the second district is defined by the state law as opening on September 1 and ending on October 31. An exception to these dates is found in Union and Willowa counties, where the season is from September 16 to November 16.

MAKES SPEEDY TRIP ON MOUNTAIN ROADS

Twelve hundred eighty miles in three days over mountain roads was the record made this week by Ralph Lucas in T. A. McCann's Oldsmobile, when he brought Mr. McCann to Bend from McCloud, Cal. Lucas left here at noon Monday, returning at three o'clock Thursday. He went by way of Crater lake.
