## Bend World War Veteran Plans To Recross Atlantic; Is Heir To Fortune Through Death Of Sister

For the twelfth time in his life and for the second time in four years, H. Cato of Bend, who holds the distinction of being one of the two oldest members of Percy A. Stevens Post No. 4, American Legion, and one of the oldest in the state to volunteer for active service in the world war, will leave early in the year for London where he will assist in settling up the estate of his sister. Miss Ellen Cato, who died recently in Sweden. Many of Cato's relatives are now living in Great Britain.

Under the terms of the will, Cato is one of the chief heirs and

will receive in the neighborhood of \$20,000. Cato plans to leave as soon as he can complete heavy contracts which he has entered into for the sale of Central Oregon potatoes. He will reengage in the potato business on a large scale on his return.

Cato's last trip to Europe was during the world war, when he embarked for France within five weeks of his enlistment in the air service.

Cato has seven nephews, all living in Great Britain, and all world war veterans. Four of them he saw during his service overseas
