National Forests Become Tourist Playground, Figures Slow

Before moving to Portland, 1,029,972 people who sought recreation within the boundaries of the national forests of Oregon and Washington during 1922. Of this number, 457,706 visited the national forests of Oregon and 572,266 those of Washington.

The figures include automobile travelers, pedestrians and others. Of these, 734,494 came by automobile, 80,203 were hunters and fishermen, 173,300 lingered to enjoy the privileges of the forest camps, and 3.884 had permits for summer homes. With this heavy recreational use of the national forests, which is encouraged by the forest service as having a distinct value in the life of the nation, comes an increased hazard for man caused fires, according to forestry officials. They point to the fact that 58 per cent of the fires on the Oregon national forests and 76 per cent of the Washington national forests during 1922 were man caused; of these, 21 per cent in Oregon and 31 per cent in Washington were caused by campers and smok-
