Dr. Raymond Balcomb will be guest speaker at the Loyalty Dinners at the First Methodist Church in Bend Thursday and Friday evenings, at 6:30. Theme for his addresses will be, "The Arrest of Papa Dio."

Dr. Balcomb, a member of the Oregon Conference since 1951, has been pastor of the First Methodist Church and Wesley Foundation in Corvallis since 1957. He has been a preaching missionary to Alaska and Hawaii.

A graduate of Boston University School of Theology with a bachelor of sacred theology degree "magna cum laude," he continued there to earn his Ph.D. degree in New Testament literature, with additional study as a resident fellow in New Testament and instructor in Greek.

Known as one of the leading preachers in Oregon, he was delegate to the General Conference of the Methodist Church in 1960.

Storms batter Great Plains

Violent thunderstorms battered the Great Plains today injuring scores of persons in Kansas where hail drifted two feet deep along rural roads.

At Topeka, Kan., 12 house trailers were toppled and destroyed by high winds and flying debris. A number of persons were injured and 14 were admitted to hospitals, none in serious condition.

The storm, located over Kansas and eastern Nebraska, dumped hail more than an inch in diameter near Grand Island, Neb., and more than 1 1/2 inches of rain in a six-hour period.

Atlanta, Ga., received .97 inches, making a total of nearly 1.50 inches for the past two days. Cincinnati, Ohio, got more rain, to total about the same amount for the same period.

Rivers in Iowa, Georgia and Missouri caused minor flooding today after a weekend of heavy rain.

Natural Resources agency receives unexpected boost

SALEM (UPI) — A proposed State Department of Natural Resources was given an unexpected push forward Tuesday night by the full Ways and Means Committee.

It sent the reorganization bill to the House floor "without recommendation."

Although the endorsement was weak, it was more than supporters thought it would get when Speaker Clarence Barton sent the measure to Ways and Means a month ago.

The action came as the committee acted on 35 measures in an effort to speed bills with fiscal implications to the floor so the 1963 session can adjourn.

The bill would gather the state's natural resource agencies into a department with a director appointed by the governor. The director, in turn, would name the heads of six divisions: Fish and game, small boats and harbors, mineral resources, forestry, water resources, and agriculture.

Ways and Means restored original proposals to merge fish and game agencies. The House Natural Resources Committee, which earlier approved the proposed department after much study, had decided to keep fish and game separate.

Agencies and interested groups that would be involved in the reorganization have resisted it.

Committee Busy

In other actions, the committee: — Approved a measure that would let the Welfare Department end the aid to dependent children program in cases where the unemployed father lives in the home, if the agency finds it advisable during the next biennium.

— Approved the transfer of \$5.5 million from the veterans bond sinking fund to the general fund to meet shortages in funds for current state services.

— Approved a \$243.7 million Highway Commission budget. The money comes from dedicated funds.

SOME HELPI

SAN DIEGO (UPI)—The San Diego Chamber of Commerce announced Tuesday it had taken steps to help relieve the "industrial congestion" in Los Angeles.

The chamber erected a large billboard in the heart of Los Angeles reading: "San Diego offers smog-free industrial sites."

Approved an increase in salaries of district judges from \$10,500 to \$11,000.

— Approved revisions in teachers' and judges' retirement plans, and in state fund investments.

— Okayed a bill to let the superintendent of a state institution stay on past retirement age. It is aimed at keeping prison Warden Clarence Gladden on the job until a successor is found.

— Approved budgets for the Fish Commission, Game Commission, Justice Department, Board of Health, Tax Commission, Council on Aging, and Corporation Department.

Columbia Compact: The Senate voted 21-9 to ratify a proposed Columbia Interstate Compact which is aimed at orderly development of resources by seven states. The compact failed to get approval in Washington this year.

— The House Labor and Industries Committee completed major policy decisions on a bill to rewrite Oregon's 50-year-old workmen's compensation law.

— Members of the House Taxation Committee formally expressed their unhappiness over a Senate Tax Committee revenue-raising plan.

— The House sent the Senate a proposed constitutional amendment to let highway revenues be used for purchase of mass transit strips.

Revenue-raising plan opposed

SALEM (UPI)—The House Taxation Committee expressed unanimous opposition Tuesday to a revenue-raising plan approved Monday by the Senate Taxation Committee.

The expression indicated a deadlock between the two houses that is almost sure to send the state's tax program to a conference committee for final decision.

The House earlier this session passed a revenue-raising package based on an income tax bill, a cigarette tax, and a one-shot measure to speed turnover of withholding payments to the state.

The Senate committee completely rewrote the income tax bill to raise \$52 million instead of \$35 million. It junked the cigarette tax and amended the one-shot bill to apply near the end of the 1963-65 biennium only if needed.

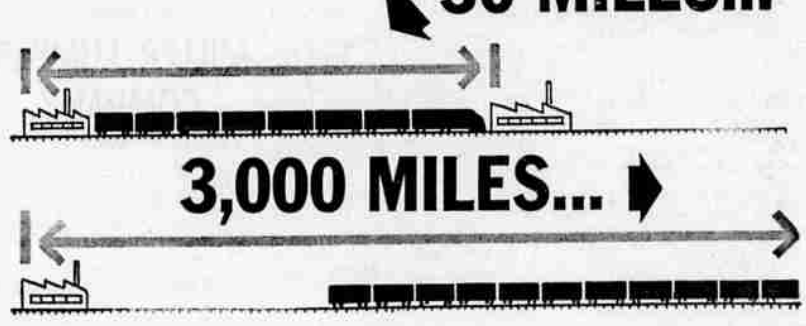
Senate action is expected soon on the Senate committee proposal.

Dr. Newburn, former president of the University of Oregon, said he would take a professorship at another university. He did not identify the school, but it was understood to be the University of Arizona at Tempe in the graduate school of education.

The resignation is effective Oct. 15.
