Sprague offers apportionment plan to solons

SALEM (UPI) — A new legislative apportionment plan was presented Wednesday to the committee that is trying to make a new constitution acceptable to two-thirds of the Senate.

Former Gov. Charles Sprague offered the plan to the Senate Committee on Constitutional Revision back Wednesday after the Senate revived it from Tuesday's defeat on the floor.

The document could have passed if eight senators had not opposed the apportionment plan of Sen. Anthony Yturri, R-Ontario. They said it would favor the least populous counties.

Both sides expressed willingness to seek a compromise.

Sprague said his plan would give "very moderate" preference to counties unable to qualify by themselves for a first legislator.

But, he said, his plan would strike a middle ground between Yturri and his opponents by leaving it up to subsequent legislatures to group these counties into districts.

Chill frosts tender crops

A May chill frosted tender fruit and vegetable crops in the nation's midlands today and broke cold records from Minneapolis to Little Rock, Ark.

The mass of cold air pressed down on most of the nation from the eastern slopes of the Rocky Mountains to the Atlantic Coast.

Farm experts were sure crops had been damaged in the Middle West. They feared for a large portion of Iowa's soybean crop, cherries and strawberries in Michigan and new crops in Indiana.

The weather had never been so cold this late in the year at Des Moines, Iowa, which posted a 32-degree record breaker.

Other record setters included 42 degrees at Little Rock, 44 at Memphis, 28 at Minneapolis, 31 at Fort Wayne, Ind., 37 at Indianapolis, 34 at Evansville, Ind., 27 at Lansing, Mich., 31 at Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., 30 at Grand Rapids, Mich., 34 at Charleston, W. Va., and 32 at Pittsburgh, Pa.

SET BELT STANDARDS

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The House Commerce Committee has approved a bill setting up standards for automobile seat belts sold in interstate commerce.

The bill, approved Wednesday, would require manufacturers to meet federal stress and tensile strength standards of the safety belts.

Land bill gets okay in House

SALEM (UPI) — Land subdivision would be regulated in an effort to keep the public from being "bilked and taken" under a bill that passed the House Wednesday and went to the Senate.

Supporters said a few land promoters have been "giving Oregon a bad name" through fraudulent land advertising and sales.

The bill, worked over several times, would require land developers to file their plans with the real estate commissioner, who would make reports available to buyers.

It would set out regulations both for land advertising and for actual sales, and would require a performance bond from the developer to ensure completion of promised improvements.

The House also: —Passed and sent to the Senate a bill to broaden Oregon's program of medical assistance to the aged, a program partly supported by federal Kerr-Mills grants. The bill would ease eligibility requirements. The program involves \$3.8 million in state general fund money for 1963-65.

—Approved creation of a district court at Grants Pass. The bill went to the Senate.

—Passed and sent to the Senate a bill authorizing the welfare commission to expand food stamp and surplus food programs.

—Passed budgets for the Department of Motor Vehicles, the State Labor - Management Relations Board, the State Scholar-

ship Commission, the secretary of state, the corporation department, Hillcrest School, MacLaren school, the Correctional Institution, and the penitentiary.

—Passed a bill raising salary ranges of most non-civil service state employees such as administrators and commissioners. It also raises pay for state police. It went to the Senate.

—Passed a truth-in-lending bill aimed at making it easier for consumers to understand credit changes. It went back to the Senate in an effort to resolve House changes.

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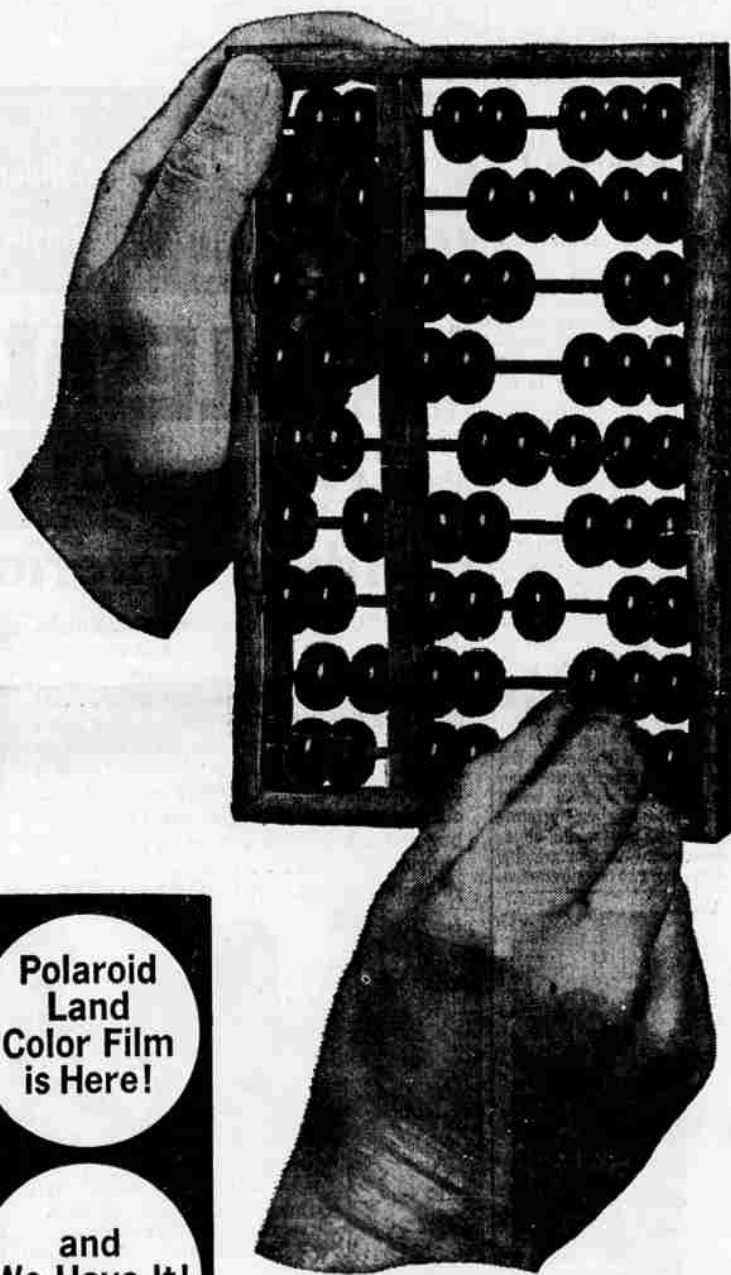
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
