Milk distributor faces law suits

The Oregon State Department of Agriculture is the plaintiff in civil suits filed last week against County Milk Sales, Inc. Judgments are sought from Oregon Milk for \$339.67, determined by an audit as the underpayment due eight producers, and \$105.77 allegedly due 29 producers.

Both suits are based on alleged underpayments for the period from Sept. 1, 1961, to May 31, 1962.

SALE OF TIMBER

LIONHEAD LOGGING UNIT
Sealed bids, in duplicate, on forms provided therefor, marked outside "Bid for Timber, Lionhead Logging Unit," addressed to the Superintendent, Warm Springs Indian Reservation, Warm Springs, Oregon, will be received until 2:00 P.M., Pacific Daylight Time, June 25, 1963, for the purchase of timber within the Warm Springs Indian Reservation. The unit includes an area to be logged of approximately 2,460 acres. The total estimated volume to be cut is approximately 28,650,000 ft. BM of pine, approximately 14,140,000 ft. BM of green ponderosa pine, approximately 110,000 ft. BM is merchantable dead ponderosa pine, approximately 11,220,000 ft. BM is green Douglas-fir, approximately 60,000 ft. BM is merchantable dead Douglas-fir, and approximately 3,120,000 ft. BM is green white fir and other species, which estimates are not guaranteed. Each bidder must state the price per thousand feet BM Scribner Decimal C log scale that will be paid for timber cut and sealed. No bid will be considered for less than \$20.20 per thousand feet BM for green ponderosa pine, \$14.35 per thousand feet BM for green Douglas-fir, and \$2.65 per thousand feet BM for green white fir and other species. The stumpage price for merchantable dead ponderosa pine or Douglas-fir shall always be 1/5 of the rate for green ponderosa pine or green Douglas-fir. A deposit of \$15,000.00 in the form of a certified check, cashier's check, bank draft, or postal money order, drawn payable to the Bureau of Indian Affairs, or in cash, must accompany each sealed bid. The deposit of the apparent high bidder, and of others who submit written requests to have their bids considered for acceptance, will be retained pending acceptance or rejection of the bids. All other deposits will be returned promptly following the opening and posting of bids. The

deposit of the successful bidder will be applied as part of the purchase price of timber on this unit only, or retained as liquidated damages if the bidder fails to execute the contract and furnish satisfactory bond for \$25,000.00 within 60 days of the acceptance of his bid by the Commissioner, Bureau of Indian Affairs. The right to waive technical defects and reject any and all bids is reserved. The contract will specify that all designated timber shall be cut and sold on or before December 31, 1966.
