Board to withhold rating from double-shift schools

SALEM (UPI) — The State Board of Education decided Wednesday to withhold its "fully standard" recognition from schools which hold double-shift classes.

Double-shifting is the practice of sending half the students to class in the morning and the other half in the afternoon.

Dr. Leon P. Minear, superintendent of public instruction, said double-shifting because of overcrowded classrooms has been more a problem in elementary schools than it has in high schools.

But there are indications from several communities that they are planning such a permanent plan," Dr. Minear said. "It will cheat unnecessarily the youngsters in these districts."

The board also ordered schools to provide a program of, daily physical education for students in all 12 years of public school education. High school students now are required to take only two years.

Principal Loses Case
Willard C. McKinny, Klamath Falls High School principal, lost his battle to have his teaching certificate restored. The board unanimously supported Minear in his earlier revocation of the certificate and refused McKinny's application for a certificate for next year.

Marine reserve openings noted
The Marine Corps' air reserve units at the naval air station, Seattle, have openings for 1963 Oregon high school graduates who wish to fulfill their military obligation with minimum time spent away from home.

Through the trainee program, the Marines offer six months active duty in South Carolina, North Carolina and Florida, followed by membership in one of the Northwest's reserve transport or helicopter squadrons.

Students graduating from high school this June may enlist now and leave for recruit training at Parris Island, S.C., any time between now and November. After "boot camp," six-month reservists will receive four weeks of advanced infantry training at Camp Lejeune, N.C., and then transfer to Jacksonville, Fla., for an aviation school.

Upon completion of the specialist school, enlistees will return to their homes and become members of a reserve squadron at the Seattle naval air station.

Tugman park is dedicated
SALEM (UPI)—A late Oregon newspaperman who was devoted to expansion of the Oregon state parks system was to be honored today during dedication of the William M. Tugman Memorial state park, eight miles south of Redport.

Tugman, an Oregon editor and publisher for more than 30 years, championed the wise use and development of the state's natural resources.

Polite gunmen grab \$50,000 worth of jewels

MIAMI BEACH (UPI) — Three polite gunmen robbed hotel owner Jack Lieberbaum and his wife of \$50,000 in jewels Wednesday and escaped down the Intracoastal Waterway in a boat, calling out "good night" as they sped away. The men surprised the couple when they returned home about 1 a.m. after an evening out. Police said the bandits entered the house through sliding glass doors facing the waterway.

A 19-foot combination inboard outboard motorboat, apparently stolen, was found aground at Pelican Harbor more than a mile from the Lieberbaum home shortly after the holdup. Police said it may have been the one used by the robbers.

Included in the jewelry taken was a \$25,000 diamond ring which Mrs. Lieberbaum had in a drawer upstairs. Police said it was "about 13 karats." The bandits also took \$150 in cash from Lieberbaum.

The thieves apparently knew about the valuable ring, Lieberbaum said they asked his wife to show her hands and when they saw she was wearing only a gold wedding band, demanded: "Where's the diamond?"

Lieberbaum remarked on the "politeness" of the bandits throughout the robbery. "They were very polite," he said, "but it makes you panicky when you walk into your house and there are three bandits with guns. We jumped out of our skins."

He said he and his wife were trussed up securely with heavy cord. The men asked if either of them had any allergies or physical defects that made it hard for them to breathe.

When Lieberbaum told them his wife had an allergy, they taped her mouth very lightly so she could breathe. "Me they taped up good and tight," he said.

Lieberbaum said the men apparently had trouble starting their boat, as it took them considerable time. When they finally got it started, they yelled "good night" and headed down the waterway.

Lieberbaum is an owner of the Dunes Hotel on Miami Beach and the Sun Spa Hotel in Hollywood, Fla. He has had interests in other Miami Beach hotels and was one of the owners and builders of the \$6,000,000 Capri Hotel in Havana, Cuba, which was seized by the Fidel Castro government.

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Plane probe continuing

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (UPI)—Investigators continued the painstaking task today of trying to find out what caused a Northwest Orient Airlines DC7 military charter plane to crash in the Gulf of Alaska killing all 101 persons aboard.

The plane plunged into the gulf Monday near the bottom of the Alaska Panhandle while on its way to Elmendorf Air Force Base here from McChord Air Force Base near Tacoma, Wash.

George Baker, chief investigator for the Civil Aeronautics Board, said there was very little debris to work with.

"The things they have been able to salvage haven't been significant," said Baker at Ketchikan. "It will take a detailed examination until sufficient analysis can be made."

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Haitto paroled from jail

SALEM (UPI)—Heimo Haitto, 37, former conductor of the Salem Capitol Symphony Orchestra, was paroled from the Marion County jail Wednesday.

He had served seven weeks and two days of a 10-month sentence on a bad check charge.

The parole followed restitution of \$634 on local checks and compromise of debts totaling \$1,400 in the Seattle area.

He indicated he planned to return to his native Finland next week to teach at the National Music Conservatory at Lahti.

APPROVE TEACHER BILL
WASHINGTON (UPI)—A House education subcommittee Wednesday approved a bill that would provide \$34.5 million to train teachers for physically and mentally handicapped children.

The three-year program was one of the items requested by President Kennedy in his education message this year. The funds would go to colleges to use in preparing the special teachers.

Warning issued on fire danger

SALEM (UPI)—Expanded use of forestry shutdown authority was predicted for this summer by State Forester Dwight L. Phipps at a State Forestry Board meeting Wednesday.

Phipps warned of the extreme fire hazards resulting from timber blown down in the Oct. 12, 1962, storm.

When fire conditions become critical, Phipps has authority to suspend all lumbering operations in Oregon forests.

The board approved continuation of the Salem aerial retardant base, and signed a \$7,000 contract with Kreitzberg Aviation, Salem, to handle aerial bombing of forest fires.

The board also authorized sale of \$650,000 in general obligation bonds to finance rehabilitation of forest lands in the Tillamook Burn, and other denuded forest lands.

Sale of the bonds is scheduled for September.
